Need for the Rule(s):

- The proposed rules will codify procedures necessary to implement Senate Bill 342 from the 76th Legislative Assembly – 2011 Regular Session. In addition, we have had conversations with different stakeholders who have expressed interest in reviewing the administrative rules to help address local needs that have emerged since the rules were last updated. Some local governments have expressed concerns about their struggle to come up with cash for their required match portion, some have indicated a desire for assistance with backlogged maintenance and repairs.

Fiscal and Economic Impact:

There are no proposed fee increases or any other out-of-pocket expense associated with the proposed rules. OPRD bares the costs of administering the Local Government Grant Program, and additional department costs associated with any rule changes would be paid for using Parks and Natural Resource Funds.

There are no proposed fee increases or any other out-of-pocket expense associated with the proposed rules. Therefore, we expect the changes to have minimal, if any, fiscal or economic impact on the public or other state agencies or local governments.

Given that the proposed rule changes are expected to have minimal, if any, economic or fiscal impact, OPRD did not consult a traditional Administrative Rule Advisory Committee. Instead, the department increased its public outreach through multiple public meetings, a lengthy public comment period and seeking rule input from a rule review committee with a varied stakeholder representation.

Some local governments have expressed concerns about their struggle to come up with cash for their required match portion, some have indicated a desire for assistance with backlogged maintenance and repairs.

Public hearing meetings are scheduled for 2 hours from 6:00 to 8:00 pm.

The Agency requests public comment on whether other options should be considered for achieving the rule's substantive goals while reducing negative economic impact of the rule on business.
