Our Speaker for Saturday, January 12, will be **Karen Harless**. She will be presenting, "**How to Write and Publish Your Own Short Story**". **Karen** is a local representative promoting a software system called Heritage Makers. This system pro-

vides a format for writing a personal history, which might include photographs, and then allows for the master vendor to publish those works into a hard bound booklet up to 100 pages in size. The finished product will be returned to the subscriber in a few weeks at a cost of about \$34.95. There may be other associated costs as well, but it still is an affordable way to create a memory book worth saving. The finished product looks very nice and professional.

#### **1:00 pm—Beginners' Class**

The Beginner's Class will be conducted by **Joan Kaiser** in Conference Room 202 (2nd floor, turn right from elevator). Pre-registration not required. There is no charge, but we suggest a \$1.25 donation toward the cost of printed handouts.

This will be class #3 in the series, **Map, Wills and Probate Records, and Military Records**. **Joan** will cover how to use maps to help with your genealogical research, what land records can tell you, genealogical information in wills and probate records and the types and importance of military records.

**Willamette Valley Genealogical Society’s DNA Project**

WVGS has started a DNA Project for both men and women. To join under WVGS...

1. Go to the State Library URL at: <http://oregon.gov/OSL/GRES/genealogy.shtml>
2. Click on Genealogy Research on the left.
3. Click on WVGS DNA Project
4. Click on the Family Tree DNA icon in the middle of the page.
5. Scroll to the bottom of the next page and complete the form
6. Click CONTINUE to complete the next screen
7. Be sure to click only once when you are done so you order just one test.

You will receive a confirmation in your email box that your order was taken. Remember: Only men can order the Y-DNA test, but both men and women can order the mtDNA. It is cheaper to order the Y-DNA 37 marker test as it will tell you that you have a common ancestor within genealogical time for persons you match. Lesser tests (12 markers) provide information on older ancestors prior to 600 years ago. However, you may wish to start small and upgrade. For the mtDNA order both the HVR1 and HVR2 panels (mtDNA plus) as this will give you the best information on your ethnic origins. Again, you can start small and upgrade, if needed.

**Nancy Dickey**

Nancy is the Genealogy Volunteer on Mondays. She has been a volunteer since 1992 and has been interested in genealogy for 25 to 30 years. She originally got interested as she was the “keeper of old things” for her family, including pictures that needed to be identified. She started with her Norwegian family and switched to researching her husband’s family also.

Nancy plans on doing DNA testing to help find out where her family came from, including a Smith. She has made many trips to the Family History Library in Salt Lake City and recommends it to everyone, not only for the microfilm but books, family histories and maps also. Nancy has made trips to Illinois, Ohio, Kansas and Oklahoma looking for information on families, especially looking for land records.

Since Nancy was spending a lot of time at the library, she decided to volunteer. Also there is plenty of time to work on your own genealogy while volunteering at the desk. She reminds patrons coming in for help that you still need to have some basic facts when you come in and to start from what you know. Censuses give a lot of information from 1850 to 1930. We have a lot of information on Oregon and Oregon counties. Our vertical files (in the Microfilm Room) are not used much but there is information in them on family names, letters from people requesting information and the responses, family surname newsletters, and maps of Oregon cities, including road maps.

Nancy says sometimes she has to pry information from patrons, but we have so many good resources. Particularly useful are gazetteers, the index cards in the alcove, Donation Land Claim information, early New England and Massachusetts Vital Records. Ancestry.com is a big asset to the Library, but she warns being careful about using internet information; question everything and still look at the hard copy if possible,

This information is for those of you who are researching **Oregon biographies and Oregon historical events**. The **State Library** (250 Winter St., Salem, OR) has an index of nearly **1,300,000 cards**, arranged by name/topic and covering a date range from 1915 to the mid 1980's. These cards contain citations to newspapers, journals and books in our collection. The topics are focused on Oregon events. The **Oregon Biography Index** contains over 800,000 references to Oregon citizens. These entries index both obituaries and news articles/biographies about the individuals.

For those of you who need additional help with genealogy research, volunteers from the Willamette Valley Genealogical Society are available for consultation and research at the State Library (Salem). Many local libraries provide electronic access to Oregon newspapers through a database, America's Newspapers. Most Oregon libraries provide access to The Oregonian (1988 +). Some will provide access to the full database, which covers 11 Oregon newspapers and hundreds more from across the nation. This database is an archive of articles and is not the same as using a newspaper's web page. I hope this information is helpful.
