**Willamette Valley Genealogical Society's
DNA Project**

**WVGS has a DNA Project for both men and women.
To join under WVGS:**

1. Go to the State Library URL at: <http://oregon.gov/OSL/GRES/genealogy.shtml>
2. Click on Genealogy Research on the left.
3. Click on WVGS DNA Project.
4. Click on the Family Tree DNA icon in the middle of the page.
5. Scroll to the bottom of the next page and complete the form.
6. Click CONTINUE to complete the next screen.
7. Be sure to click only once when you are done so you order just one set.

You will receive a confirmation in your e-mail box that your order was taken. Remember: Only men can order the Y-DNA test, but both men and women can order the mtDNA. It is cheaper to order the Y-DNA 37 marker test as it will tell you that you have a common ancestor within genealogical time for persons you match. Lesser tests (12 markers) provide information on older ancestors prior to 600 years ago. However you may wish to start small and upgrade. For the mtDNA order both the HVR1 and HVR2 panels (mtDNA plus) as this will give you the best information on your ethnic origins. Again, you can start small and upgrade, if needed.

(Tabled from the September meeting)

Two important issues will be discussed at the October meeting:

- 1) Due to a recent problem, we will be reviewing our **Research Policy**. One part is to meet with Robert and Alice of the Oregon State Library to have a clear policy on handling requests.
- 2) The second part is to review WVGS's Research Policy. Our minimum fee is **\$10 per hour**, on the low side and we will discuss increasing this.

If you would like to have input into this issue, be sure to attend the October meeting at 10 am on October 8th at the Oregon State Library, Room 102.

We have an agreement with Ancestry. So far our collection has been filmed and we were awaiting indexing. Ancestry has a long list of indexing to do and we are several **years** down the list. WVGS would probably have need to have volunteers do our own indexing.

However, Ancestry asked if we would like participate in their Beta testing of a way to get indexing done sooner. As part of the Beta testing, Ancestry will set up a website with our scanned images, Ancestry will pay other indexers, and we will have access to the scanned images as indexing is going on. The members approved this proposal and Ancestry is working on it now.

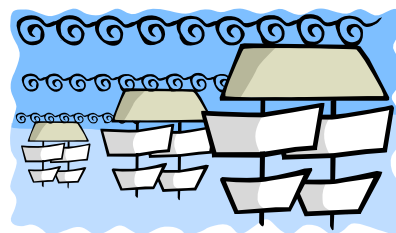
