Narrative summary:

Leilani Esping, our Afterschool Resource Specialist and school age trainer developed a curriculum book list of 101 best resources and worked with the individual libraries to purchase the books that they felt would be good additions to their collections. The project plan was to have the curriculum materials available for attendees of the trainings, so they can have a hands on experience – developing activities that are intentional and focused on outcomes. We created flyers to promote the training in the seven library locations and bookmarks to give to programs that attend. Samples are included with this report. We publicized the trainings in our e-newsletter, shared with all our partner organizations and published with the child care resource and referral on their website and e-news.
