1. The first goal of the project is for the archivists from each of four universities to identify and agree on guidelines, standards, and best practices for processing the political manuscript collections and hire a project archivist to complete the second two goals.
2. A second goal of the project is to create new access points such as finding aids, digital and physical exhibitions, and online research guides.
3. A third goal of the project archivist will be to identify a portion of appropriate materials from each gubernatorial collection to be digitized.

Narrative summary:

A consortium of four public and private higher education libraries (Willamette University, Portland State University, Pacific University and Western Oregon University) have set long-term goals for cooperatively identifying, soliciting for donation, processing, preserving, and making available online information relating to the non-official and personal papers of 13 Oregon governors since World War II. Work on the identification and solicitation continues as part of the planning grant. This grant will focus on processing the personal papers of three of these recent Oregon governors—Barbara Roberts, Victor Atiyeh, and Robert Straub. Information about their terms and life will be preserved and made publicly available. Historical themes associated with the papers of these governors will help future voters, students, and scholars understand the political climate and legacy of the state of Oregon. The grant will provide for a full-time, professionally-trained project archivist to physically process the papers of the three gubernatorial collections using guidelines agreed upon by the group and current processing standards for political manuscript collections. The project archivist will also produce an EAD finding aid for each collection, which provides descriptive information for users to understand what each collection contains. These finding aids will be made available online through publicly discoverable databases. Building on the previous LSTA planning grant using the Straub papers, the archivist will also identify appropriate materials from each collection to be digitized using best practices and standards. Portions of these collections will be made available online to the public, K-12 and college students, as well as researchers in future stages of the cooperative project.

General summary of activity:

The completion of the grant has resulted in the complete processing of all materials accessioned as of the beginning of the grant; the creation of EAD finding aids that are now hosted and full-text searchable on the NWDA site, as well as tagged with Library of Congress Subject Headings and NWDA browsing terms; one physical exhibit and initial preparations for a second; the identification of materials to be prioritized for digitization, both for preservation and exhibit purposes; and the initial digitization of selected materials and creation of online access tools.

As a further means of publicizing the project, Katrina and two of the other archivists involved in the grant, Eva Guggemos of Pacific University and Erin Passehl of Western Oregon University, will be presenting at the national conference of the Society of American Archivists in August; Katrina is also preparing an article for the Northwest Archivists' newsletter, *Easy Access*.

3. Report on specific project objectives to date:

Objective 1: The first goal of the project is for the archivists from each of four universities to identify and agree on guidelines, standards, and best practices for processing the political manuscript collections.	Progress / Results: 0% / 100%

First Quarter

The archivists for each of the four universities have identified and agreed upon guidelines, standards, and best practices for the processing of the personal papers gubernatorial collections in

this project that are at their institutions. This occurred through both an in-person meeting at Pacific University in March and through email conversations.

Second Quarter

The archivists from each of the four institutions, along with the project archivist, met with staff at the Oregon State Archives in Salem in September to discuss gubernatorial record retention schedules and public records laws in Oregon. This will help the project archivist when processing collections to be aware of any sensitive information that may need to be pulled out.

First Quarter

Each of the four institutions had a person on the search committee for the Project Archivist. The position was posted in April 2012 in time for the Northwest Archivists annual conference. Responses were analyzed by the search committee in early May, and one round of interviews was conducted via Skype for three finalists. One candidate stood out for her previous work with gubernatorial papers. After conducting reference checks, the candidate, Katrina Windon, was offered the position in June, and officially started on June 29, 2012. Katrina relocated from Texas to Oregon in July and began work that month.

Objective 3: The project archivist will process the papers of the three recent gubernatorial collections. The project archivist will travel between the three locations in 2-4 month intervals at each host institution.	Progress / Results: 10% / 100%

Second Quarter

Katrina created a processing plan that could be readjusted and fine tuned for each processing project at the three institutions. This, along with the creation and weekly updating of a private blog, helps foster good communication between all parties.

Katrina began working at her first location, Portland State University (home of Barbara Roberts' papers) following an initial period of meetings with the relevant shareholders and a variety of background research to familiarize herself with Oregon's modern political history and with the life of Barbara Roberts. Katrina first created a rough collection inventory, which allowed her to gain a better idea of the contents of the collection and preservation risks as well as original order and filing conventions, where they were evident. Following this inventory, Katrina created a processing plan, which has guided the remainder of the project. Katrina will remain at PSU for another two weeks before moving on to work at Pacific University with Victor Atiyeh's papers.

To keep the various grant administrators apprised of any processing progress, Katrina created a private blog where she writes weekly reports of her progress. All four archivists can monitor her progress online as well as assess how fast the collection is being processed, which is useful for future statistics.

At Pacific University, Katrina began working on the Victor Atiyeh papers by assessing and augmenting existing accession records to create a more complete inventory of the collection. Using that information, Katrina created a processing plan that was reviewed by the archivist at Pacific. Since Atiyeh is still donating materials to the collection, Katrina joined the University Archivist on several collecting trips, which made the processing plan much more fluid than Roberts' collection.

Following the holiday break, Katrina began work at Western Oregon University, where she will be processing the Robert Straub Papers. Katrina read the recently published biography on Straub to gain a better sense of his life and see what materials from the collection were used in the book. She will begin working with the university archivist on a processing plan shortly.

Third Quarter

Since the beginning of January, Katrina has worked at Western Oregon University to process the Robert W. Straub Collection. Katrina has worked closely with WOU archivist Erin Passehl in processing the collection. This involved creating a preliminary inventory, researching previous work completed on the collection, assessing supply needs, taking basic preservation steps (such as sleeving photographs), creating a processing plan, and arranging and describing the materials. As part of the research process, Erin and Katrina met with two members of the Straub family to solicit their assistance with photograph identification.

Fourth Quarter

In the final quarter of the project, Katrina finalized the finding aid for the Robert W. Straub Collection and [uploaded the guide to the NWDA site](#). She also processed the Robert W. Straub Oral History Project, a related research collection at Western Oregon University, arranged for the creation of DVD access copies of materials on non-standard media, and created a [finding aid that has been uploaded to the NWDA site](#).

Objective 4: The project archivist will create new access points (and potentially digital exhibits or collections) and increased visibility and usability of the gubernatorial collections.	Progress / Results: 25% / 100%

Second Quarter

Katrina has provided access to Barbara Roberts' collection throughout the stages of incomplete processing, and to this end she worked to fulfill an off-site research request and worked one-on-one with a researcher. Katrina created a display the Barbara Roberts Papers, to coincide with the annual Oregon Archives Crawl event, which took place in October. These steps have already

raised further awareness of Roberts' collection at PSU. In the next two weeks, Katrina will create an EAD finding aid for Northwest Digital Archives and a MARC record.

In mid-October, Katrina completed work on the Barbara Roberts Papers at Portland State University. She completed the finding aid and uploaded it to both [PSU's site](#) and to the [Northwest Digital Archives \(NWDA\) site](#).

With respect to Atiyeh's papers, the proposed arrangement differed substantially from the final arrangement due to almost half of the materials covered in the final finding aid being received after the creation of the processing plan. The finding aid for the collection was completed mid-December and was uploaded to [NWDA](#). Description of the Atiyeh Papers was completed in greater detail than Roberts' collection because of the smaller size of the collection.

In addition to processing the collection, Katrina also worked to create a small digital exhibit containing selected materials that were digitized to professional standards and assigned Dublin Core metadata. The digital exhibit was created using the Omeka platform. It can be viewed at: <http://exhibits.lib.pacificu.edu/exhibits/show/atiyeh>.

Third Quarter

Katrina is finalizing the descriptive finding aid for Straub's papers using Archivist's Toolkit software and will upload it for public access to the [Northwest Digital Archives \(NWDA\) site](#) in the next week.

In addition to processing activities, Katrina assisted in the curation of a small display to accompany a public event held on the WOU campus. Author Charles Johnson gave a talk and book reading from his new biography published on Straub, *Standing at the Water's Edge*. Katrina also began working with Erin and other archives staff to redesign the permanent physical exhibit featuring Straub Collection materials for the third floor library exhibit space.

For the remaining quarter of the grant, Katrina will work with archivists from Western Oregon University, Portland State University, Pacific University and Willamette University on the creation of a universal portal website to direct researchers to the three gubernatorial collections covered by the LSTA grant, and to be potentially used by other Oregon archival institutions that hold personal gubernatorial papers. The portal will serve as an access point and a research tool and a way to highlight connections between collections dispersed throughout the state. Katrina will also assist with an expansion of the Atiyeh digital exhibit and create a finding aid for the Straub Oral History Project Collection.

Fourth Quarter

The majority of her time at the project's conclusion has been spent in creating and expanding online access tools to promote the collections covered by the grant. The centerpiece of this activity was the establishment of a [portal website, *Portal to the Personal Papers of Oregon Governors*](http://www.wou.edu/provost/library/archives/oregongovernors/) (<http://www.wou.edu/provost/library/archives/oregongovernors/>), hosted by and to be maintained by Western Oregon University, to serve as a launch pad to archival materials about Atiyeh, Roberts, and Straub. This site, created using Wordpress, will be maintained on Western Oregon University's servers and may be expanded in the future to include information about other Oregon gubernatorial papers. Katrina has identified themes and materials for a future long-

term physical exhibit to be implemented in the coming year at WOU, and met in conjunction with the WOU Exhibits Coordinator to discuss design and formatting options.

Objective 5: The project archivist will identify appropriate materials in each collection to be digitized at the end of this project or at a future time, depending on how much time is left after processing the three collections at each of the three locations.	Progress / Results: 80% / 100%

Second Quarter

As Katrina processes the gubernatorial papers, she will start to identify potential materials appropriate for digitization. Depending on time left after processing at all three institutions, Katrina will work on digital exhibits or collections for the remainder of the grant.

Fourth Quarter

Katrina has digitized, described, and uploaded additional materials to supplement the existing Straub Beaches digital collection, as well as provided the University Archivist with recommendations for future digitization efforts. She has researched and provided metadata for extensive additions to the Atiyeh digital exhibit. For several hundred items uploaded by student workers, Katrina has worked off-site to apply descriptive metadata to photographic and textual resources dating to Atiyeh's gubernatorial career. Thematic selections of these newly described digital objects have been incorporated into the Omeka exhibit.

PROCESSING PLAN – BARBARA ROBERTS

SURVEY OF COLLECTION:

Received arrangement:

31 of 73 boxes had some form of box labeling; labeling was accurate for most but not all box contents. The clearest evidence of arrangement is in the speech files, which were generally foldered by event and arranged by date (though for one box the arrangement was a color-coded topical system). There are many groupings that will translate into folder-level arrangement, as where materials from a conference or photos from an event are stored in the same envelope. There is also some level of arrangement for some of the clippings; some have been pasted into scrapbooks arranged roughly chronologically; others have been foldered by topic. For the most part, however, the collection lacks a clear original order, and the clippings and photographs, in particular, are widely dispersed and often unlabeled.

Physical condition (formats, condition):

The collection is primarily composed of paper documents, but also contains several boxes of photographs, dozens of VHS tapes, 1 U-matic tape, a 2" video tape, 3 3.5" floppy disks, several reel-to-reel audio tapes, and 2 cassette tapes. Also contained are dozens of plaques and awards, several oversized scrapbook and photo albums, and memorabilia (including pins, ribbons, t-shirts, and stickers).

Most materials have been housed in archival bankers' boxes; 2 boxes are in non-archival cardboard boxes.

Almost without exception, staples and paper clips are at least somewhat rusty, with a great many being exceptionally so; documents held together by them, as well as adjacent documents, are often partially discolored by the rust. Though many boxes have a small amount of dirt and dust in the bottoms, the documents themselves for the most part are clean. Some of the speeches in Box 46 do appear to have some mold damage, but are not exhibiting any signs of current activity. A handful of records on what appears to be thermofax paper show extreme discoloration, though they remain legible. Some early printouts of emails onto printer paper show signs of foxing. The most pressing condition concerns are clippings that have been taped into scrapbooks (the adhesives are often yellowing and degrading) and some photos that have stuck together or to other materials. Some photos in scrapbooks show evidence of having once been stuck together and then torn apart, which has removed some of the images; many photos have been bent by improper storage. Oversized documents have often been rolled or folded. Two photos that were in frames have been discolored by leaching of color from the frames onto the photos. The memorabilia will present a special challenge in housing and preservation; many of the early campaign stickers and bumper stickers are already showing signs of degradation. Three frames (in boxes 16 and 18; and one with the oversized materials) are broken, as is a beaded necklace, a box containing a pin, and a commemorative coaster.

Inclusive dates: 1946-2010 (bulk 1978-2002)

Privacy issues: Financial documents are included, including tax documents with the social security numbers of Roberts and her employee. Redaction will be necessary for all such materials that are not weeded.

Recommended restrictions: Although several boxes were marked as closed until book publication, now that the book has been published there is no evident need for any restrictions. Some materials indicate a need for confidentiality at the time (such as a 1990 budget draft marked as "confidential labor relations planning document"), but such indications seem to be to prevent early disclosure, not indications of permanent confidentiality issues.

Languages other than English: Japanese (minimal—on some brochures from Roberts' trip to Japan, and in small amounts on other documents, such as her business cards with Japanese on the backs).

Preliminary Weeding Recommendations:

- Deaccession (offer back to Roberts, per deed of gift): duplicates (when obvious—I don't plan on going through all the clippings to weed out duplicates); unused stationery; publications not directly related to Roberts (for instance, magazines and catalogs she or her mother received, travel books, etc.—unless annotated); memorabilia and ephemera without research value (an eyeglass holder, costume jewelry, chopsticks, unused address book, etc.); personal receipts and financial documents; Frank Roberts' plaques and awards; frames from photographs and certificates that have little exhibit value (materials removed from frames can then be sleeved and foldered); non-relevant sections of newspapers (where the whole newspaper rather than a single clipping has been kept); items entirely without context (for instance, loose business cards unrelated to other collection materials; loose post-its that have phone numbers on them; loose phone message slips that don't hold independent research value); 2 photo albums from Western Governors' Association meetings in years Roberts did not attend (these appear to have been created and sent by the Association to all Western governors, regardless of attendance); some scenery photos
- Deaccession (dispose of without offering back to Roberts): empty envelopes and folders; frames with broken glass; plastic and paper bags that have been used to house materials
- Image and return original: Plaques; three-dimensional awards; ephemera/memorabilia without significant exhibit value (napkins, t-shirts and campaign ephemera for other candidates, etc.); dedication and title pages of books gifted to/by Roberts
 - To be determined: whether to keep a hard copy of the image, a digital copy, or both (which would be ideal, balancing the primarily print nature of the collection with the potential for future digital exhibits); if keeping a digital copy, where would it be stored, in lieu of a DAM? What monitoring procedures would be in place?
- Request permission from Roberts to distribute as a promotional tool (at Archives Crawl or similar events): Duplicate campaign materials (pins, flyers, stickers, governor's portrait prints)
- Separations: Within Roberts' papers are five boxes that are not directly related to her (initial browsing didn't even turn up any correspondence with her), though she had interactions with at least three of the individuals in question and in many cases shared similar causes and interests (I haven't yet found any evidence of her working with Gearhart, though presumably she did, to have gained his papers). Roberts is clearly not

the creator of these papers, however, and it would be best to separate these papers into separate collections; in two cases, the creators have existing collections at PSU that these materials could be incorporated into. These materials are from:

- Betty Roberts, relating primarily to her gubernatorial and senate campaigns (campaign materials, photos, correspondence, clippings, cassette tape, etc.) [Box 66]
- Gretchen Kafoury, relating primarily to campaigning and to her interest and involvement with the Democratic Party, feminism, NOW, and the Elected Women of Oregon (correspondence, magazines, clippings, notes, etc.) [Boxes 29, 35]
- Peter Grundfossen, in his capacity as Government Relations Officer for the Association of Oregon Housing Authorities (policy statements, position papers, news releases, testimony, correspondence, minutes, etc.) [Box 23]
- Franklin Gearhart, in his capacity as a member of Citizens Interested in Bull Run, Inc. (reports, clippings, memos, correspondence, etc.) [Box 65]

PLAN:

Due to the high research value of the collection, the nature of the grant, and the relative lack of original order, this collection should receive a fairly high level of processing. I recommend folder-level processing, with item-level description for audiovisual and oversized materials. Due to the deteriorated condition of many staples and paper clips, the worst of these will be removed throughout processing; full staple removal will be part of a compiled list of preservation recommendations. As much as time and supplies permit, processing will also include sleeving photographs and negatives.

Supplies: Archival folders, photograph sleeves (for photos that are primarily 3x5 and 4x6; several dozen 8x10; about a dozen 5x7), negative sleeves, acid-free paper for interleaving

Digitization: The collection's audiovisual and electronic materials will all need digitized at some point in the near future, if their contents are to be accessible for future researchers. While some of these materials are of minimal research value (such as a promotional video a clothing company mailed to Roberts), others will offer a unique look into Roberts' campaigns, speechmaking, and public presence, as well as present an excellent outreach and educational tool. Prioritization: While there are a variety of strategies and concerns in prioritizing digitization, for this collection I would advise prioritizing based primarily upon research value and carrier obsolescence; other mitigating factors include uniqueness, property rights, and item condition (though all relevant materials appear to be in good condition).

APPENDIX B

PROCESSING PLAN – VICTOR ATIYEH

Collection name: Victor Atiyeh Papers

SURVEY OF COLLECTION:

Received arrangement:

Many of the items are foldered or bound, giving some indication of original order; materials relating to transmittal and destruction of records to the State Archives, for instance, are in hanging file folders, and certain sets of correspondence have been foldered as “Keeper” letters or by correspondent. Others records, such as materials relating to international trade mission trips, are grouped roughly by box. Other materials, particularly campaign materials and memorabilia, were stored without clear arrangement. The OHS Oral History transcripts are particularly well-organized, with the transcripts foldered in tape order and accompanying the CDs. The clippings scrapbooks also present a unified set, and are arranged in chronological order.

For some photos and memorabilia items, particularly earlier accessions, Atiyeh wrote brief explanatory notes to records before transferring them to the archives.

Physical condition (formats, condition):

The collection is composed of about 25.5 linear of feet of boxed materials, as well as 24 clippings scrapbooks and a variety of oversized framed materials. The collection is primarily composed of paper documents, though there are also dozens of loose photo prints, several photo albums, hundreds of slides, dozens of VHS tapes, CD-ROMS, several U-matic tapes, 3 audio tape reels, and several cassette tapes, in addition to framed materials, plaques, flags, buttons, bumper stickers, and other ephemera and memorabilia. In addition to materials directly created or acquired by Atiyeh or Denny Miles, his former staff member, are scans and images produced by Pacific University library staff of materials of which Atiyeh wished to retain the originals. At least half the materials are in archival records boxes, but many are currently in non-archival cardboard boxes.

Most items appear to be in good condition, though the glass on the frame of at least one of the oversized materials is cracked. One binder containing photos has an unidentified black stickiness on its back cover; though this does not appear to have affected the binder’s comments, removal of the contents from the binder will be necessary to prevent damage to any adjacent records.

Inclusive dates: 1958-2011 (bulk 1964-1987)

Privacy issues: Atiyeh has expressed a desire for all collection materials to be open, and other than the recommended restrictions discussed below, the materials appear to be free of confidential information.

Recommended restrictions: At least one document, which has already been set aside, is specifically stamped “restricted,” and contains the psych evaluation of a prisoner. Any similar documents that are encountered during processing will also be set aside, and access to these

documents will need restricted. There is also an immunization certificate of Atiyeh's included—it's pre-HIPAA, so won't need restricted after his death, but I think under the relevant law would still need closed until then. I can look into that more, since it is an interesting record relating to his foreign travel.

Languages other than English: A few materials related to Atiyeh's trips and economic development activities are in foreign languages, primarily Arabic and Chinese

Preliminary Weeding Recommendations:

- Excessive duplicates (for instance, campaign materials for which there are a dozen of copies of a bumper sticker)
- Empty envelopes and other packaging material that provides no added context or informational value
- Transfer to circulating [Book of the States volumes] or special collections [*The Oregon Constitution and Proceedings and Debates of the Constitutional Convention of 1857*, with a note that it was presented to Denny Miles in 1980 from Cecil Edwards, Sec. of OR Senate]: books donated by Denny Miles
- Possibly image and return to Atiyeh, or transfer to a museum: Ceremonial shovel; commemorative ceramic plate; brick made by Oregon State Prison inmates in 1912, collected by Victor Atiyeh from the Pacific University campus circa the 2000s

PLAN:

Due to the high research value of the collection and the fairly manageable size, this collection should receive a fairly high level of processing. I recommend folder-level arrangement, with series or subseries level description, and with basic item-level titling for unfolded audiovisual and oversized materials.

For the most part, labeled folders and bound materials will be preserved as folder units to preserve original order; however, if the label is simply "Misc." or some variation thereof, I plan to redistribute the materials.

Although it's not traditional best practice, since the Denny Miles donations will be included in the Atiyeh Papers, I'd like to integrate them up to the subseries level, although maintaining them as separate at the folder level so that the distinctions can still be made clear in the finding aid. That is, instead of creating a separate series of "Denny Miles" that runs parallel to a "Victor Atiyeh" series, I think it would make more sense to distribute them where relevant—primarily into the Audiovisual and International Relations subseries of the gubernatorial papers.

As Atiyeh is still donating items to the collection, piecemeal, I have attempted to make the arrangement scheme as extensible as possible; folder numbering will not be done to prevent inevitable refolding to make room for future accretions.

SURVEY OF COLLECTION:

Received arrangement:

Any original order has been obscured by previous handling of the collection (which includes one person hired to work specifically on the collection, as well as several members of the library staff whose duties included overseeing the collection). Some accession records, in Past Perfect files, give indication of the order in which the collection was received, but not as regards internal groupings. Conversation with Jerrie Lee, who was one of the staff members involved, indicates that most arrangement done was format-based, in an attempt to group like materials with like, but many boxes and folders no longer match the labels that had been applied. Materials that have been semi-processed have been processed to different degrees; some correspondence has been filed at the item level, while other correspondence has been grouped by first letter of correspondent's last name, or within a topical file, and most has not been processed at all.

Interspersed throughout the collection are administrative and research materials (print-outs of articles written about Straub after his death; scanning guidelines; partial box inventories; etc.).

The Straub Oral History Project has largely been boxed together.

At least one box of materials appears to have been created by Straub's brother, Thomas; several boxes of materials primarily relate to Pat Straub. Prior to my arrival, the University Archivist separated out several boxes of staff members' materials into separate manuscript collections. Some materials have been pulled for a semi-permanent exhibit in cases near and in the Straub Conference room.

Several out cards and other informal notices of removals are found throughout the collection; most of these materials appear to have been returned.

Extent:

Approx. 40 linear feet (84 boxes, of varying sizes; 18 unboxed albums and binders; oversized framed objects; oversized flat objects from map cabinet; artifacts)

Physical condition (formats, condition):

The bulk of the collection is correspondence, clippings, and photographs. Photographs are present in almost every imaginable size; the collection also contains many negatives and slides, including some negatives that seem likely to be nitrate (highly problematic) and some that are definitely acetate (still problematic, though not dangerously so), as well as uncut rolls of negatives.

Audiovisual materials include reel-to-reels, cassette tapes, VHS, U-matic, and Quad tapes. Many of these—and, at first glance, all of the oral histories—have already been digitized to DVD, but several have not been.

Other format types include legal papers, financial papers, printed materials, plaques, paintings, children's drawings, certificates, legislation, and, campaign materials.

Most items are in fair to good condition. Many older bound volumes (including day books and ledgers) are more fragile, having broken spines and/or flaking covers. Scrapbooks are generally in poor condition; some have been dismantled, and the majority have adhesive damage, yellowing pages, broken bindings, discolored and curling photographs, or other issues. A few folders of materials show signs of rodent damage, in which parts of documents have been eaten away. Most materials relating to Straub's brother Thomas are extremely dirty. Many smaller frames are in poor condition, and the matting for a watercolor is warped.

The collection contains a large quantity of newspaper clippings, correspondence, and other materials on acidic paper; these are generally yellowing, with the exception of more modern clippings.

One folder contains a large sheaf of carbon paper whose text has almost entirely faded; it is uncertain whether any of the information may be retrieved.

Privacy issues and recommendations:

- Applications for the Spray scholarship sponsored by the Straubs include students' GPAs and personal information—weed
- Paperwork from Salem Self-Help Housing has tax returns with others' personal information and SSNs—weed
- Family photos include some standard naked baby/toddler photos, as well as of a woman in a bra—return to family
- Health records for several of Straub's children-- return to family
- Employee payroll info for a Straub campaign contains employee SSNs--redact
- The family has expressed desire for certain materials to be restricted, and after consulting with Erin these restrictions will almost certainly be respected.

Languages other than English:

Some Spanish-language instructional materials

Preliminary Weeding Recommendations:

A further discussion with Erin is necessary to determine the desired collection scope. Currently, many of the papers relate to the Straub family and to his wife's family, including large amounts of genealogical materials and family photos. Also present in large quantities are clippings, photocopies, and research materials about Straub compiled after his death, probably by the previous archivist. For instance, it might be desired to create a separate Pat Straub, Straub Family, Stroud Family, and/or Thomas Straub manuscript collection (if it's desired to keep all these papers united, the collection would then be the Straub Family Papers). That said, my preliminary recommendations would be:

Return to family:

- All non-original genealogical materials; Stroud family genealogy
- Straub's children's drawings and school papers, unless specifically mentioning Straub

- Thomas Straub's personal papers, not relating to Bob Straub (possibly disposing of the erotica manuscript first?)
- Family photos and documents that may have privacy concerns (see above)
- Most duplicates (exceptions being photographs and audiovisual materials, in which case triplicates and above would be returned, and campaign materials, in which case it may be beneficial to keep all, to have display copies)
- Un-annotated photocopies of published materials, digitized materials, and materials whose original is not fragile and is more legible than the copies (a possible exception may be for clippings, in which case the photocopy is acting as a preservation reformatting. Since these are non-original materials, I'd argue for keeping clippings that have been arranged in scrapbooks, included with correspondence, or grouped with related materials, but not loose piles of clippings, and certainly not their photocopies as well. Depending on WOU researchers' ability to access newspaper databases, however, keeping more may be justified).
- Obsolete audiovisual materials whose digital copies have been checked for completeness and quality (for instance, the oral history tapes, which in fact include a note from their creator indicating that they should be disposed of once transfer to DVD was completed)
- Straub's father's books of title and deed records (these are old, and interesting as material objects, but not directly related to Bob Straub's life, or even to Oregon history)
- Unbound advance copy of biography by Chuck Johnson (keeping the bound copy)

Sample and return the remainder to family:

- Family photos—weeding out scenery, in particular, but also most photos not directly involving Straub (for instance, an album of Pat's trip to South Africa with her cousin)
- Pat's papers—keep that relating to her and Bob's relationship, her position as First Lady, or her organic gardening and publications

Image and return originals to family:

- Plaques with minimal/no display value

With permission of the family, offer to the Lane County Historical Society:

- Thomas Straub's Lane Reporter materials

Deaccession:

- Clippings not relating to Straub, Oregon politics contemporary to his involvement, or organizations/businesses he was involved with, and not otherwise annotated
- Pictures/art/inspirational sayings torn from magazines, appliance warranties, receipts, etc.
- Previous archivist's notes (once reviewed); previous archivist's personal print-outs (mother's obituary, SAA announcement); Michael O'Rourke's cover letter for position as Johnson's assistant, etc.
- Marbles, seashells, rocks, decorative objects, and similar ephemera

Transfer within WOU Archives:

- Move to Dan Goldy Papers: folder of Goldy materials (part of which may, in fact, be moved to administrative files), and a placard with a clipping about Goldy
- Move to Archives administrative files: Correspondence with Mike Straub about the archives; notes about previous scanning procedures; Oral History Project notes; etc.; probably, other records regarding the Straub Archives and its Advisory Board (or these could be incorporated as another series in the collection)

- Create a vertical file-type research file with all the clippings printed off and biographical materials compiled after Straub's death (or, just weed it all, depending on space issues/database access issues for researchers)

PLAN:

Owing to the history of collection handling, the arrangement imposed will not attempt to take original order into account, except in the case of bound materials, such as scrapbooks.

I propose, similarly to the processing of the Atiyeh Papers, that the Straub Papers received folder-level processing, but with at least brief description of folder contents, except where the folder title is entirely self-explanatory.

I propose dividing the collection into three discrete units: the Robert W. Straub Papers, the Robert W. Straub Oral History Project Collection, and a vertical file on Straub (which, alternately, can be a "Biographical Materials" subseries within the Personal Papers series, or its own series). Depending on further discussions, a Pat Stroud Straub Papers collection would also be a strong possibility, though determining a clear boundary between such a collection and her husband's papers would be problematic.

A few notes on the proposed arrangement:

- *All sub-subseries are estimated, and are likely to be added to once processing begins*
- *Provenance isn't clear for many records—materials after Straub's death are obviously not created by Straub, but may have been collected by family members, library staff members, or, it appears, an indistinguishable combination of the two. I plan to note, as much as possible, when items are clearly not from Straub or his family, but in many cases it's not clear, and any arrangement will necessarily contain items from multiple creators.*

Basic preservation steps to be taken throughout processing include the sleeving of photographs and negatives; interleaving acid-free tissue between scrapbook pages; and carefully brushing loose dirt off of frames and volumes. Recommendations will be made for further or professional conservation work, where necessary.

Ideally, a date will be arranged with surviving family and staff to help identify some of the mass of unlabeled photos and provide further context for some items.

Biographical Note

Victor George Atiyeh (1923-) served as Oregon's 32nd governor from 1979-1987.

Atiyeh was born Alfred George Atiyeh February 20, 1923 in Portland, OR, to two Syrian immigrants, George and Linda Asly Atiyeh. His parents never used the name Alfred, and he was christened Victor George Atiyeh. He has two older brothers, twins Edward and Richard.

After graduating from Portland's Washington High School, where he was a standout football player and president of his senior class, Atiyeh attended the University of Oregon as a pre-law major from 1941-1943. A member of the Epsilon Omicron chapter of Phi Gamma Delta, he continued to be involved with the fraternity throughout his life. He was a guard on the University of Oregon football team, and was scouted by several NFL teams and offered a position with the Green Bay Packers. After his father's 1943 death, however, with both of his brothers still involved in WWII, Atiyeh left school to assume the presidency of Atiyeh Bros. Carpets, the family business that his father and uncle founded in 1900. He held that position until 1979, when he resigned after winning the governorship. In 1944 he married Dolores Hewett, with whom he attended high school and college. They have two children, Tom and Suzanne.

Atiyeh served three terms in the Oregon House of Representatives (1959-1964). He then served four terms in the Oregon State Senate (1965-1978), serving as Minority Leader from 1971-1978. With almost 20 years in the legislature, Atiyeh had a longer state legislative career than any other Oregon governor.

He first ran for governor in 1974, with the slogan "Oregon's Next Great Governor," but was defeated in the general election by Democrat Robert (Bob) Straub in Atiyeh's only electoral defeat. In 1978 Atiyeh, running with the slogan "It's Time for Atiyeh," defeated incumbent Straub to become the first Arab-American governor in the United States. As governor, Atiyeh's agenda included tax reform, increasing government efficiency, workers' compensation, economic diversification, international economic development initiatives, responsible land-use, environmental conservation, and the establishment of Oregon Food Share, the nation's first statewide food bank. Faced with an economic downturn and a state budget deficit, Atiyeh's cost-cutting measures included cutting his own salary--three times. As governor, Atiyeh appointed Oregon's first female chief of staff, Geraldine (Gerry) Thompson, as well as Oregon's first female Supreme Court justice, Betty Roberts.

Active in the Republican party, Atiyeh chaired the Republican Governors' Association as well as the Western Governors' Association. He served as a National Republican Convention delegate in 1968, 1972, 1976, and 1984.

After leaving office in 1987, Atiyeh founded Victor Atiyeh & Company, an international consulting and trade firm of which he is the president. On retainer for firms such as Fujitsu America and Seiko Epson, he continued to travel widely and contribute to Oregon's economic development activities and to national foreign policy concerns under the George H.W. Bush administration. He served as president of the Japan-America Society of Oregon and as an Executive Committee member of the American Task Force for Lebanon.

A Boy Scout leader since the age of 21, Atiyeh served in several positions in that organization, including Council President. Atiyeh served on the boards of Equitable Savings & Loan, Cedars Bank, Key Knife, Greenbrier Companies, Inc., the Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs Museum, the National Association of Arab-Americans, and the Oregon Wildlife Heritage Foundation, among other organizations. He also served as Chairman of the Board of Atiyeh International, Ltd., his son Tom's carpet company. Atiyeh is a former Pacific University trustee and served on the University of Oregon's President's Committee. An avid collector of guns, historical documents, and materials regarding the 1905 Lewis and Clark Exposition in Portland, Atiyeh has been a member of the Oregon Historical Society and the Washington County Historical Society. He was appointed by President Reagan to the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation in 1984. A lifetime member of the National Rifle Association (NRA), he helped found the NRA-affiliated Oregon Arms Collectors group. Atiyeh continues to be active in civic and community organizations.

Arrangement

The Victor Atiyeh Papers have been arranged into three subject-based series: Professional Papers, Campaign and Election Papers, and Personal Papers.

Series 1, Professional Papers, contains records relating to Atiyeh's business and political activities, and is divided into subseries by business or office, and arranged roughly in chronological order: Atiyeh Bros., Inc.; State Representative; State Senator; Governor; Victor

Atiyeh & Company; and Post-gubernatorial Political Activities. Within the larger subseries, papers are further arranged into sub-subseries by format (such as, in the case of the Governor subseries: Art, Audiovisual, Correspondence, Memorabilia, Photographs, Press Clippings, Schedules, Scrapbooks, and Subject Files). This arrangement is not mutually exclusive; materials of all non-audiovisual format types are found within subject files. Folders are arranged alphabetically within each subseries or sub-subseries.

Series 2, Campaign and Election Papers, is divided into two subseries: Atiyeh Campaign Files and Collected Campaign Materials. Folders with Atiyeh's campaign materials are arranged chronologically by campaign, and alphabetically within each campaign. Collected Materials are arranged by candidate, where a bulk of materials is present, and by format for the remainder. Other collected campaign materials are also present within Republican National Convention materials in the Professional Papers series.

Series 3, Personal Papers, consists of materials regarding Atiyeh's personal life, particularly his family. It has been divided into five format-based subseries: Art, Correspondence, Photographs, Schedules, and Subject Files. Folders within each subseries are arranged alphabetically or, in the case of the Schedules subseries, chronologically.

Where quotation marks are found in a folder title, the portion in quotations reflects either a published title or an original file name assigned by Atiyeh. Many of Atiyeh's files were originally kept in binders; where papers have been removed from the original binders for preservation reasons, a note has been made at the file level. Because material is still being added to this collection, only basic information about box locations has been added to this guide; we foresee that as more material is added, box locations will be updated and refined.

Content Description

The Victor Atiyeh Papers contain materials from his business, political, and personal activities, dating from 1923-2012, as well as collected materials and family papers predating the primary body of the collection. The bulk of the materials pertain to his campaigns for and his service in political office, particularly his two terms as Governor of Oregon, 1979-1987, and to the international consulting business he established after leaving office in 1987. Collection materials include appointment books, audiocassettes, awards, budgets, campaign materials, certificates, correspondence, directories, memoranda, memorabilia, notes, photographs, poll results, posters, press clippings, publications, receipts, reports, schedules, scrapbooks, speeches, and video tapes.

Beyond offering insight into the life and career of Atiyeh and into Oregon politics from the 1960s-1980s, the collection contains significant materials regarding issues and organizations such as the Republican Party; Oregon tax policy; Japanese-Oregon international and trade relations; Rajneeshpuram; the Confederated Tribes of the Warm Springs Reservation;

The bulk of the Victor Atiyeh Papers were donated by Gov. Atiyeh to the Pacific University Archives in a series of 16 accessions received from 2011 through 2012. A copy of Atiyeh's oral history was donated by the Oregon Historical Society in 2012, and two accessions of materials (primarily slides and video) relating to Atiyeh's gubernatorial career were donated by his former press secretary, Denny Miles, in 2012.

Detailed Description of the Collection

Professional Papers, 1918-2012

Atiyeh's professional papers encompass both his business and political activities, from his involvement with Atiyeh Bros., Inc., the family business, through his terms in the Oregon State Legislature, the State Senate, and the governorship, his subsequent international consulting business, and his continued involvement in Oregon and international political issues.

The bulk of the materials in this series relate to his time as governor, with a particular emphasis on his international trade missions; similar trips he carried out as part of his private consulting business are also well represented. The papers relating to Atiyeh Bros. are primarily promotional in nature, rather than business documents, with the exception to this being some early receipts that predate Atiyeh's involvement with the company. Though Atiyeh's legislative career is less well-documented than his gubernatorial career, the records, from correspondence to press clippings, offer evidence of the respect Atiyeh garnered across party lines, Atiyeh's growing involvement with the Republican party at the national level, and Atiyeh's early involvement with tax policy.

One particularly comprehensive source regarding Atiyeh's gubernatorial administration is the set of binders created by and for gubernatorial staff; the "Everything You Wanted to Know But Were Afraid to Ask Book" and the "Son of the 'Everything' Book" cover everything from staff contact information to biographical notes on the governor and first lady. The governor's schedules and appointment books offer an overview of his daily activities. Other materials of note in the Governor subseries include documentation regarding Mount Saint Helens (particularly its 1980 eruption), the Rajneesh situation, budget and tax issues, and energy issues. Another resource of note is the compilation of administration success stories staff members gathered to help Atiyeh prepare his farewell address; they provide accounts of how the administration helped individual Oregonians as well as the state as a whole.

Personal Papers, 1931-2012

The Personal Papers series primarily consists of documents relating to Atiyeh's family, awards and honors won, his involvement with the Boy Scouts of America, and his involvement with his college fraternity, Epsilon Omicron. Letters Atiyeh wrote to his parents while he was attending the University of Oregon offer a detailed and candid insight into his life before entering office. The oral history conducted by the Oregon Historical Society (OHS) offers Atiyeh's own account of his life, with particular focus on his terms as governor. Plaques and award certificates, as well as supporting documentation, reflect the respect Atiyeh garnered in both his political and personal endeavors; some he personally gave great weight to include the State Capitol Press Corps' recognition of his administration's openness, a recognition from the National Conference of Christians & Jews honoring Atiyeh's work to combat discrimination, and the Japanese Order of the Sacred Treasure.



Governor Barbara Roberts, 1991-1995. Democrat.



Campaign materials (Barbara Roberts Papers, Portland State University)

A fourth-generation Oregonian, Roberts was born Barbara Kay Hughey December 21, 1936 in Corvallis, OR.

The challenges Roberts faced in finding adequate education for her autistic son, Mike, encouraged her to found the Portland chapter of the National Society for Autistic Children, and then to enter to enter politics as a lobbyist in 1969. She first sought elected office at the local level, and served on the Parkrose School Board (1973-1983) as well as on the board of Mt. Hood Community College (1978-1981). Roberts served as a State Representative for District 17 from 1981-1985, and as majority leader (the first woman to hold that position in Oregon) during her second term. She served as Secretary of State from 1985-1990, and was elected as Oregon's first female governor in 1990. While governor, Roberts worked closely with the Clinton administration, particularly in establishing the Oregon Health Plan and a joint state-federal effort, the Oregon Option. To educate voters about her tax plan, created in the hopes of making up for some of the shortfall created by Measure 5, Roberts pioneered the Conversation with Oregon, an enterprise utilizing the state's Ed-Net system, to communicate via an interactive video link with voters across the state. Despite this effort and her strong lobbying efforts on behalf of the plan, voters did not pass the plan. She also used the Ed-Net system in her teen pregnancy prevention efforts. Among the many other issues that she has advocated for during and after her time in office are environmental issues, early childhood education, gay rights, pro-choice measures, public transit, and the right to death with dignity.
