Abandoned and Derelict Vessel Removal

Why are abandoned and derelict boats a problem?



ADV Removal Program



- Any public body can seize a vessel that:
- has been left on their property without authorization (abandoned)
 - is sinking, obstructing a waterway, endangering life or property (derelict), or
 - is leaking pollution (derelict)



\$ 150,000 every 2 years for removal projects

Transient Use

DSL rule

30 days, 5 miles (once per 12 months)

Boat can be seized for trespass



ADV Seizure Process



Methods of Disposal:


- Auction
- Direct haul to landfill
- Boatyard/shipyard demolition



Boatyard/shipyard demolition



Boats only qualify for the Marine Board's funding program if they are on the water (below the high tide line). The funds cannot be used for boats already out of the water.



Option for public and private marinas: possessory lien






Registration

- Tie each vessel to an owner
- Require current registration
- If it's not longer commercial, it should be registered with the state!



Vessel Turn-in

- Voluntary surrender
- Flexible implementation
- At-risk recreational vessels



Moorage Rules

- Require insurance, vessels to be in seaworthy condition, move under their own power at least once per year
- Alert others if a problem vessel is evicted

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Statewide Information

2013-2015 Biennium

30 boats removed, ~\$118,000 (\$90,00 from OSMB)

22 "live-aboard" boats removed from Portland area, ~\$61,000



2015-2017 Biennium

13 boats removed so far (~\$90,000)



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
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NOAA Funding Opportunity - Marine Debris Removal
