


# Probation Violation Warrants



## POINTS TO REMEMBER:

1. The arrestee has already been arrested, tried and convicted of the original crime (burglary, larceny, rape, etc.).
2. The Probation Violation (PV) is a new crime entirely. It is the new original crime for PV warrant purposes.
3. There is no category for PV, so it is classified as "All Other - Other" (code 269).
4. All Other - Other is a Part 2 Crime.
5. As with other warrants, if the warrant is for a Part 1 or Part 2 crime from YOUR jurisdiction, you code the arrest as if it was for the original offense. In this case, 269, All Other - Other.
6. Also in keeping with other warrants, if the warrant is for a Part 1 or Part 2 crime from ANOTHER jurisdiction, you code the arrest as "Fugitive" (code 55). In this case, All Other - Other is a Part 2 crime, so the arrest for a warrant from another agency would be Fugitive.
7. It does not matter if the original offense that the arrestee was convicted of was a Part 1, Part 2 or Part 3 crime. PV in itself is a Part 2 crime and PV warrants are treated accordingly.
8. This process also applies to Failure To Appear (FTA) Warrants.
