

Work Begins On Walker Mountain

Ground is broken 7,000 feet above Klamath County for the new microwave tower and building being constructed by the Bonneville Power Administration. The Oregon Wireless Interoperability Network will partner with BPA on Walker Mountain by covering 50% of the design and construction costs for the project and will share space on the new 140-foot tower. This project will allow for the removal of an older tower and building located in the Historic Resource area on the mountaintop. The Walker Mountain Radio Station is a key location in BPA's communications infrastructure for the five Northwestern states. It's also an essential site for OWIN's mission to upgrade Oregon's public safety communications systems in conjunction with Klamath County and other local partners
