STATUS: 20 percent contained. Spotting in heavy fuels. OSFM task force personnel continue to protect structures.

RESIDENCES EVACUATED: 120 residents have been evacuated from the communities of Crescent Lake Junction, Diamond Peaks subdivision, East Odell Lake Lodge, Crescent Lake Lodge and the summer residences at Odell and Crescent Lakes.
