

CHAPTER 27

HAZARDOUS MATERIALS-GENERAL PROVISIONS

2701.1 Scope. Prevention, control and mitigation of dangerous conditions related to storage, dispensing, use and handling of hazardous materials shall be in accordance with this chapter.

This chapter shall apply to all hazardous materials, including those materials regulated elsewhere in this code, except that when specific requirements are provided in other chapters, those specific requirements shall apply in accordance with the applicable chapter. Where a material has multiple hazards, all hazards shall be addressed.

Exceptions:

1. The quantities of alcoholic beverages, medicines, foodstuffs, cosmetics, and consumer of industrial products containing not more than 50 percent by volume of water-miscible liquids and with the remainder of the solution not being flammable, in retail or wholesale sales occupancies, are unlimited when packaged in individual containers not exceeding 1.3 gallons (5 L).
2. Application and release of pesticide and agricultural products and materials intended for use in weed abatement, erosion control, soil amendment or similar applications when applied in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions and label directions.
3. The off-site transportation of hazardous materials when in accordance with DOT regulations.
4. Building materials not otherwise regulated by this code.
5. Refrigeration systems (see Section 606).
6. Stationary storage batteries regulated by Section 608.
7. The display, storage, sale or use of fireworks and explosives in accordance with Chapter 33.
8. Corrosives utilized in personal and household products in the manufacturer's original consumer packaging in Group M occupancies.
9. The storage of distilled spirits and wines in wooden barrels and casks.
10. The use of wall-mounted dispensers containing alcohol-based hand rubs classified as Class I or II liquids when in accordance with Section 3405.5.
11. **Oregon Revised Statutes 466.605 through 466.680, 468B.300 through 468B.335 and 466.200 through 466.205 and administered under Oregon Administrative Rules (OAR).**

ORS 466.605 through 466.680 are not a part of this code but are reproduced or paraphrased here for the reader's convenience.

ORS 466.605 through 466.680 define the regulations for spill response and cleanup of hazardous materials.

ORS 468B.300 through 468B.355 are not a part of this code but are reproduced or paraphrased here for the reader's convenience.

ORS 468B.300 through 468B.335 define the regulations for oil or hazardous spillage with regard to water quality.

ORS 466.200 through 466.205 are not a part of this code but are reproduced or paraphrased here for the reader's convenience.

ORS 466.200 through 466.205 define the regulations of procedures for emergencies and also liability for improper disposal of waste with regard to the storage, treatment and disposal of hazardous waste.

OAR 340, Division 108 is not a part of this code but is reproduced or paraphrased here for the reader's convenience.

OAR 340, Division 108 defines the regulations for spills and other incidents with regards to hazardous waste management.
