



2012 Mob Plan Committee Update Oregon Office of State Fire Marshal

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The 2012 Mobilization Plan Committee has been busy reviewing and updating the 2012 mob plan. Changes include cleaning up needless language and creating an easier to read lay out. In addition there are policy changes related to mutual aid, reimbursements and training requirements.

Policy changes are being made to ensure that we are administering the mobilization plan in the most fiscally responsible manner while creating training opportunities to the Oregon Fire Service. In addition it is important that we ensure that the mobilization plan and its policies are directly related to the original intent of the conflagration act. Below are policy changes with explanations in italics. This is not a complete list as we are continuing to meet, however we wanted to provide an overview so that you see these before it is released for review in Feb.

- Reimbursement of mutual aid will begin after the conflagration has been invoked **and** after their mutual aid agreement hours have been exceeded. *The OSFM is currently paying mutual aid resources for hours that they are currently agreeing to provide mutual aid for. Payment for reimbursement will be after those agreement hours are exceeded.*
- Mutual Aid will be defined as fire service resources in the form of Task Forces and Strike teams and its personnel. Not local incident management personnel. *The conflagration act was created to provide assistance in the form of equipment and personnel, we will continue to reimburse local TF and ST under mutual aid, but we will not reimburse local IMT that are at a conflagration.*
- Personnel responding under the mobilization plan cannot respond while on vacation leave. *If an individual is on vacation leave they are not covered under their department's worker's compensation policy and not able to respond.*
- An interface FF2 will be added to the interface position qualifications Requirements. *This will allow fire fighters who do not have a completed FF1 task book to respond while providing opportunities for additional training and experience.*
- Individuals will be allowed to respond to conflagrations in a trainee role if there is a qualified individual in that same capacity. The trainee must be a member of the

task force and currently working on their qualifications. This position is **not** an additional member of the taskforce. *This will allow fire fighters to respond while providing opportunities for additional training and experience.*

- The Mob Plan committee is looking to delete many of the appendices that are in the mob plan. We are soliciting input on how the departments use these and if you think they should stay in the mob plan.

Task Force/Strike Team information-

- We are looking to incorporate into the TFL/STL training the need to ensure that all documents pertaining to TF or ST are turned in prior to demobing i.e. evaluations, claims/accident reports etc.
- Ensuring that drive time is similar to and from an incident. Ideas that we are discussing are moving to trip tickets in the future.
