Our guest speaker today is Ed Serra, Superintendent of the Clatskanie School District.



He received his Bachelor of Arts in Music Education from Central Washington State University and his Masters in Administration and Curriculum from Gonzaga University. Ed taught music, Language Arts and Computer Applications and has been a principal at all grade levels. In 2001 he was selected as the Middle School Principal of the Year for the State of Washington. Ed is currently an instructor for City University in Washington teaching School Finance and Organizational Management, Conflict Resolutions and Negotiations, and Personnel Management in their Educational Leadership Program. This past June, Ed received the university's 2009 "President's Award for Excellence in Teaching" from among the university's twenty-seven world-wide sites.

He has been involved in many community organizations such as Rotary International where he served as the president for East Bremerton Rotary. He was president of the Bremerton Symphony Board and a member of the Bremerton Community Learning Center Advisory Board, The Kitsap County Human Rights Commission, the North Kitsap Boys and Girls Club Board.

Ed is active in Columbia County, currently serving on the Columbia County Commission on Children and Families, the Columbia County Public Health Advisory Committee and the Clatskanie Arts Commission. In the area of emergency preparedness, he was an instructor and trainer for the Kitsap County Emergency Management Center teaching the EOC portion to county school districts as well as other organizations. Ed is also on the Columbia County Homeland Security Emergency Management Committee where he serves as the Vice-Chair.
