Agency Overview

OSP is not just the “highway patrol”, but a full-service public safety agency, providing diverse services to the citizens of Oregon. The Department is comprised of five divisions:

The Office of the Superintendent

The Superintendent oversees the people and programs of OSP, including more than 1300 employees in 70 offices located throughout the state. The Professional Standards and Public Information offices report directly to the Superintendent.

Police Services Bureau

This bureau is made up of the Patrol, Criminal Investigation, Fish and Wildlife, and Research and Development Divisions which provide law enforcement services statewide.

Public Safety Services Bureau

This bureau includes the Office of the State Fire Marshal, the Office of the State Medical Examiner, the Forensics Division, the Law Enforcement Information Services Division, the Gaming Division, and Command Centers.

Administrative Services

This division is made up of the Budget Section, Business Services and Technology Services.

Employee Services and Organizational Development

This division is made up of the Training and Recruiting Section, Human Resources, and Payroll.
