



# Oregon State Police Briefs 2009

## **Agency Overview**

OSP is not just the “highway patrol”, but a full-service public safety agency, providing diverse services to the citizens of Oregon. The Department is comprised of five divisions:

**The Office of the Superintendent and Deputy Superintendent** This office oversees the people and programs of OSP, including more than 1300 employees in 70 offices located throughout the state. The Office of the State Fire Marshal, Professional Standards, the Gaming Enforcement Division, and the Public Information officer report directly to the Superintendent or Deputy Superintendent.

## **Police Services Bureau**

This bureau is made up of the Patrol and Fish and Wildlife Divisions which provide law enforcement services statewide.

## **Public Safety Services Bureau**

This bureau includes the Criminal Investigation Division, the Office of the State Medical Examiner, the Forensics Division, the Law Enforcement Information Services Division, and Command Centers (dispatch offices).

## **Administrative Services**

This division is made up of the Budget Section, Business Services, Human resources and Technology Services.

## **Planning and Organizational Development**

This division is made up of the Training and Recruiting Section, and oversees policy and planning for the department.
