



PRISM measures how effective Oregon's workforce agencies are at helping people find and keep jobs and improve wages

PRISM Fast Facts – Region 4 – February 2014

- The employment rate for individuals who completed services from Oregon's workforce system during the second quarter of 2013 was 72.9 percent, 2.8 percentage points above the year-ago rate of 70.1 percent.
- During the third quarter of 2012, the retention rate was 63.1, a decrease of 3.2 percentage points from the year-ago rate of 66.3 percent.
- Those who completed services during the second quarter of 2012 registered an average hourly wage gain of \$1.38 after one year. This one year wage gain is \$0.05 lower than the year-ago gain of \$1.43.
- After working three years, individuals completing services during second quarter 2010 registered an average hourly wage gain of \$2.96, an increase of \$0.68 from the year-ago wage gain of \$2.28.
