PRISM Fast Facts – Title II, Adult Basic Education – February 2014

- Employment data not available for the current quarter. The year-ago employment was 40 percent.
- During the third quarter of 2012, the retention rate was 57.5, a decrease of 3.2 percentage points from the year-ago rate of 60.7 percent.
- Those who completed services during the first quarter of 2012 registered an average hourly wage gain of \$1.10 after one year. This one year wage gain is \$0.09 lower than the year-ago gain of \$1.19.
- After working three years, individuals who completed services during second quarter 2010 registered an average hourly wage gain of \$2.03, an increase of \$0.20 from the year-ago wage gain of \$1.83.
