OREGON SCORE TRANSFER

The NAPLEX Score Transfer Program is made available to individuals who wish to transfer their North American Pharmacist Licensure Examination (NAPLEX) to state(s) in which they wish to hold an additional license by examination.

Individuals must submit a National Association of Boards of Pharmacy (NABP) NAPLEX Score Transfer Form (found on the last page of the NABP NAPLEX/MPJE Registration Bulletin) and NABP fee **prior to, or postmarked no later than** the date on which the individual is to take the NAPLEX.

NABP's Score Transfer fee is currently \$75 per state. The fee must be submitted in the form of a money order, bank draft, or certified check made payable to the National Association of Boards of Pharmacy or NABP. NO REFUNDS will be provided under any circumstances.

After you take the NAPLEX examination, NABP will notify the Oregon Board of Pharmacy with your NAPLEX test results. If you have passed the NAPLEX, the Oregon Board of Pharmacy will mail you an Oregon Score Transfer Application and letter indicating what your test score is.

The current Oregon Score Transfer Application fee is \$200. This is an administrative fee and is separate from the \$75.00 fee you submitted to the NABP.

To be eligible to Score Transfer to the State of Oregon, you must be a graduate of an American Council of Pharmaceutical Education (ACPE) University or College of Pharmacy.

If you are a Foreign Pharmacy Graduated and received a pharmacy degree from outside the United States and are attending an ACPE accredited University or College of Pharmacy in order to obtain your Pharm.D. degree, please contact the Oregon Board of Pharmacy for additional requirements.

The State of Oregon uses the Multistate Pharmacy Jurisprudence Examination (MPJE) to test you on both Federal and State Pharmacy Laws and Rules. Included in the Oregon Score Transfer Application envelope will be an order form if you wish to order a hard copy of the Oregon Revised Statutes and Oregon Administrative Rules. The fee for these Laws and Rules is currently \$15.00.

The Multistate Pharmacy Jurisprudence Exam (MPJE) is administered through Pearson VUE Testing Centers. The examinations are given Monday thru Saturday at various Testing Centers located throughout the United States.

To be eligible to take the Oregon MPJE exam, you must meet Oregon's Intern requirements. Individuals must:

- Be a graduate from an ACPE accredited school or college of pharmacy, or
- Hold a certificate from the Foreign Pharmacy Graduate Equivalency Committee (FPGEC) and have passed the Test of Spoken English with a score of not less than 50 or the TOEFL iBT with a minimum score of 26 for the Speaking part of the examination.

Note: You must have the University or College of Pharmacy from where you graduated send evidence of your pharmacy degree and the date it was granted to the Oregon Board of Pharmacy.

- Completed 2000 hours as an Intern.

Note: Your hours must be sent to us from the Board of Pharmacy in the state in which you gained your Intern experience.

If you do not have a total of 2000 hours of internship, you may apply to become an Oregon Intern in order to gain the remaining hours.

Upon successfully passing the Oregon MPJE examination, you will be mailed an Oregon Pharmacist License Application. Pharmacist Licenses are currently \$120. Once we have received your Pharmacist License Application, it will take between 7 and 10 business days to process. Please note that the Oregon Board of Pharmacy does not issue Temporary Licenses.
