**FINAL ORDER**  
**As of SEPTEMBER 17, 2013**

Under ORS 455.895(1)(b) and OAR 918-001-0036, the Electrical and Elevator Board (Board) proposes to take disciplinary action against you in the form of a \$3,000 civil penalty, because you violated Building Codes Division statutes or rules as follows:

**FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

(1) During all relevant times, you were not licensed in Oregon as an electrical contractor or journeyman electrician.

(2) On or about June 17, 2013, you advertised as an electrician for hire, offering electrical services on the World Wide Web (craigslist.com), for the account of another, without an Oregon electrical contractor's license, in violation of ORS 479.620(1).

(3) On or about June 26, 2013, at 16855 SW Somes Lane, Beaverton, Oregon, you agreed to install an electrical outlet, for the account of another, without an Oregon electrical contractor's license, in violation of ORS 479.620(1).

(4) Installing an electrical outlet, as described above, is an electrical installation as defined in ORS 479.530(10).

**WHAT THE LAW SAYS**

(1) Under ORS 479.620(1), a person may not, without an electrical contractor's license, engage in the business of making electrical installations, advertise as or otherwise purport to be licensed to make electrical installations or purport to be acting as a business that makes electrical installations.<sup>1</sup>

<sup>1</sup> OAR 918-030-0010(8) states that for purposes of ORS 447.040, 479.620, 480.630 and any other license regulated by ORS chapter 455, "engaging in the business" means to advertise or solicit, contract or agree to perform, or to perform, work for which a license or permit is required under Oregon law, including but not limited to a single instance.



1 **NOTICE OF FINAL ORDER**

2 If you do not request a hearing within 20 days, withdraw a hearing request, notify the Board or the  
3 administrative law judge that you will not appear, or fail to appear at a scheduled hearing, the Board  
4 will issue a Final Order by Default. If the Board issues a Final Order by Default, it designates the  
file, including any materials submitted by you that relate to this matter, as the record, for purpose of  
proving a prima facie case.

5 You are entitled to judicial review of any final order issued in the matter of this Notice of Proposed  
6 Civil Penalty. Judicial review may be obtained by filing a petition for review with the Oregon  
7 Court of Appeals within 60 days after the Final Order is served. See ORS 183.482. If the Order  
8 was served on you in person, the date of service is the date you received the Order. If the Order was  
9 served through the mail, the date of service is the day the Order was mailed, not the day you  
lose the right to appeal. The informational phone number for the Oregon Court of Appeals is (503)
