 Trail Armoring and Drainage structures - 450 Trail, 15 Mile, 8 Mile and Knebal Springs. More trails work available if needed to fill out a crew assignment. It would be preferable to have members of the crew certified to use chain saws and cross cut saws. Youth must be able to hike 5 miles and provide all needed personal protective equipment (PPE). This work could be accomplished with day crews if they were commuting from within an hour of the location of project work (The Dalles, Hood River, Gov. Camp, Maupin, etc...); however, it would be preferable to use crews capable of camping closer to the trails. Front country camping would be Monday-Friday and crews would need to supply all of their own sleeping equipment, cooking utensils and tools. Trails to be maintained are the following but may include others depending on access, Forest Creek ,Hidden Meadows, Boulder Lake, Little Boulder, and Crane Creek. Maintenance of Bonney Meadows Campground and sections of Bonney Meadows trail. Rock tread work along access trail to campground.
