Approximately 13 miles trail in the Elk Meadows Area will need tread work, drainage work, and brushing. There is also improvement of the trail crossing on the Timberline trail at Newton Cr. needed. It would be preferable to have members of the crew certified to use chain saws and cross-cut saws. Youth must be able to hike 5 miles and provide all needed personal protective equipment (PPE). This work could be accomplished with day crews if they were commuting from within an hour of the location of project work (Hood River, Gov. Camp, etc...); however, it would be preferable to use crews capable of spiking out on the trails or camping in front country campgrounds. Crews would preferably spike out monday-friday on the trails and would need to supply all of there own sleeping equipment, cooking utensils and tools. Spike out camping locations available and would be coordinated with trail crew leader. More trails work available if needed to fill out a crew assignment.

Approximatly 12.5 miles of the Lost Lake Area Trails would require cleaning ditches and drainages, cleaning culverts, brushing, and cleaning debris from boardwalk. May need to do some boardwalk repair (relevel, replace tread etc...). Approx 3 weeks of work, all none wilderness. It would be preferable to have members of the crew certified to use chain saws and cross-cut saws. Youth must be able to hike 5 miles and provide all needed personal protective equipment (PPE). This work could be accomplished with day crews if they were commuting from within an hour of the location of project work (Hood River, Gov. Camp, etc...); however, it would be preferable to use crews capable of spiking out on the trails or camping in front country campgrounds.
