### Specific Project Work To Be Completed

Old Salmon River Trail # 742A work will consist of cribbing the sides of the trail in several locations where the bank is eroding away. Other work will include tread work and rock cribbing for damaged roots. (2 weeks)

Timberline Pedestrian Trails work will include rehabbing existing user trails. Work will include collecting seeds and transplanting native wildflowers. Installing fencing or other barriers around protected areas.

Campground projects; installing barrier post, signs, picnic tables and fire rings. (2 weeks)

Timberline to Town Trail #756 construct portions of a new mountain Bike trail. Work will include incorporating bank turns and creating curves into the trail design. (2 weeks)  
Bonanza Trail # 786 trail work will include brushing and tread work. (1 week)

Government Camp Trails work and sign installation will consist of deburning and retreading trail in damaged areas. (3 weeks)

Clackamas River Trail #715 this trail needs tread work its entire length of 7.8 miles. There are several access points along 7.8 miles (3 weeks)

Cripple Creek Trail #703 tread and brushing. (1 week)

Dry Ridge Trail # 518 work includes water bars, brushing and tread. (2 week)

The program must provide an individual with extensive demonstrated experience in trail maintenance, chainsaw use, cross-cut saw use, crew supervision, trail structure replacement, and trail drainage work to work directly with the Forest Service as a liaison trail crew technical advisor for the work being completed.

The trail projects listed are day projects where the youth can commute to and from the job site. Duties include, tread, brushing, cribbing, site cleanup, restoration and rock work. Campground projects will include installing barrier post, signs, picnic tables and fire rings. This work will involve physical labor such as lifting, bending, and digging. Crews are expected to get into sites located 0-3 miles from trailhead, frequently carrying day packs and tools.
