## **MEMORANDUM**

**Subject:** Electric Vehicle (EV) Charging and Parking Facilities Improvement Project

DAS has awarded a contract for the large task of installing electric vehicle charging in multiple parking facilities as well as completing deferred maintenance and improvements to several locations. This memo provides an overview and high-level timeline.

Installing the 208 Volt, Level 2 EV charging stations will be a first phase in building the infrastructure needed for electrification of the state's light fleet vehicles and provide for employee-only access charging and limited public access. These efforts are in direct support of Governor Brown's Executive Orders 17-24 and 20-04. Goals set out in EO 20-04 for state fleet electrification were also modified and codified into ORS 283.327 by the Legislative Assembly in 2019 and 2021.

To complete this large effort will cause varying levels of disruption, temporary closures, and movement of assigned parking in affected facilities (more about this on page 2). This notice is a preliminary one and more detailed information will follow as construction timelines are solidified. Future communications will also include a link to a website that will provide project information and timeline updates.

The good news is with remote and hybrid workers canceling parking and DAS intentionally holding open some vacancies, the number of movements necessary have been minimized to the degree possible. However, several facilities will need to temporarily close completely, including Green Lot and Commerce Lot. Parkers displaced during construction will be returned to their original location if possible but there will be changes in some space assignments in reserved facilities because of reconfigurations of parking spaces due to code-required improvements and the need to adjust to the new EV charging spaces.

The table below shows the number of charging ports planned for installation and the level of impact to lot usage.
