## IMPORTANT NOTICE FOR INDIVIDUALS RECEIVING CERTAIN FOUNDED OR SUBSTANTIATED CHILD ABUSE DISPOSITIONS:

## BEFORE PROVIDING CARE FOR CHILDREN IN CERTAIN SETTINGS, YOU <u>MUST</u> BE ENROLLED IN THE CENTRAL BACKGROUND REGISTRY

If you received a founded or substantiated disposition for child abuse that occurred on or after <u>September 1, 2019</u> and <u>involved a child for whom you were either providing child care as</u> defined in ORS 329A.250(4)<sup>1</sup>, or care identified in ORS 329A.250(4)(a)<sup>2</sup>, (c)<sup>3</sup>, (f)<sup>4</sup>, (g)<sup>5</sup>, (h)<sup>6</sup> or (i)<sup>7</sup>

or

If you received a founded or substantiated disposition for child abuse that occurred on or after January 1, 2017, and involved a child who died or suffered serious physical injury, as defined in ORS 161.015,<sup>8</sup>

then

You must apply to and be enrolled in the Central Background Registry before providing:

- care in the home of the child;
- care for children from only one family other than your own family; or
- care for no more than three children other than your own children.<sup>9</sup>

The Central Background Registry enrollment requirement is effective for seven years after the date of the abuse determination for individuals with founded or substantiated dispositions for

ORS 329A.250(4). Child Care does not include the conduct listed in ORS 329A.250(4)(a) to (i). <sup>2</sup> "In the home of the child;" ORS 329A.250(4)(a).

child abuse after September 1, 2019, unless the abuse disposition involved a child who suffered death or serious physical injury, as defined in ORS 161.015.

The law does not establish a time limit for the Central Background Registry enrollment requirement for individuals with founded or substantiated dispositions for child abuse that occurred on or after January 1, 2017 and involved a child who died or suffered serious physical injury.

## How to Apply to the Central Background Registry

To apply for enrollment in the Central Background Registry, you must complete the CBR-601-A application.
