

Turning violations into environmental projects

The Oregon Department of Environmental Quality enforces environmental laws to protect Oregon's air, land and water. The DEQ Office of Compliance and Enforcement issues fines and requires violators to correct violations. Typically, these fines go to the state of Oregon general fund. DEQ's Supplemental Environmental Project policy allows up to 80% of fines to go to projects that benefit human health and the environment.

Help us make this policy work for you

DEQ will be updating its policy on supplemental environmental projects to make them more equitable and accessible. DEQ is hosting two information and listening sessions in June 2023. These are meant for facilities, interested community-based organizations and community members. DEQ will share information about how the policy works to provide funds to CBOs and asking about how the policy could improve.
