 - Health burdened

Environmental justice criteria under consideration

Economically distressed

→ Financial burden paying for water infrastructure

Health burdened

→ Environmental pollution had greater impact on health

Pollution burdened

→ Negative effect on quality of life





Economically distressed

Low income: At least 30.9% of the population lives under 200% of the poverty level (CDC/ATSDR Social Vulnerability Index, EPA), **OR**

High unemployment: At least 3.4% of the population 16 years and older in the civilian workforce are unemployed and at least 80% of the population 18 years or older is not enrolled in higher education (EPA, Climate and Economic Justice Screening Tool)




Health burdened

Low life expectancy: Below the 30th percentile for life expectancy, OR

Elevated health risks: Above the 70th percentile for rates of asthma, heart disease or diabetes (Climate and Economic Justice Screening Tool)

"Percentile" = A number where a certain percentage of scores fall below it





Pollution burdened

Located near contaminated waterbody: Located within 1 km of major waterbody or 2 km of minor waterbody that is impaired (CalEnviroScreen), **OR**

Located near facility with a health violation: Located within 1 km of a facility with a health violation

	Located near a facility that has a compliance violation	Located within 1 km of a wastewater treatment facility with a health violation.




Low Income Census Tracts




Low Income Counties


Portland Metro Tri-County Low Income Census Tracts




Economically distressed – High unemployment



 Above the 70th percentile for asthma, diabetes or heart disease




Distribution of Life Expectancy by Census Tract



Health burdened - Life expectancy


Life expectancy at or below 30th Percentile





Health burdened - Asthma


Asthma rate at or above 70th percentile





Health burdened - Diabetes


Diabetes rate at or above 70th percentile

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Distressed Areas in Oregon

Business Oregon gives priority when funding technical assistance, programs, and projects to geographic areas determined to be economically distressed as prescribed by Oregon law.

Below is a list of identified distressed areas in Oregon. This is the update for 2022 and will be in effect through the end of 2022. The department publishes updated lists every year at the end of December under the normal methodology and every month under the temporary methodology.

Biz. Ore. distressed city	170	1,448,260	73%	50%
Low-income OR high unemployment	196	2,704,924	84%	94%
