INTERSTATE COMPACT (DAWN PERSELS)

Dawn introduced new Interstate Compact employee, Woody Fogleman, as well as the current extradition officer for DOC, Nicole Kellogg. Dawn also advised that her job rotation with Compact has been extended to April 1, 2011.

NATIONAL TRAINING 1/31/11 – 2/04/11: Training will be conducted at 4 sites throughout the state.

NEW RULE PROPOSED BEGINNING 3/1/2011: Any sex offender who is *required to register* is considered a **violent crime offender**, and will be retaken at *any significant violation*. A nationwide warrant must be issued by sending state. (Remember: Violation Report vs. Progress Report)

NATIONAL AUDIT OF ICOTS IN MARCH 2011: Be sure to run reports to clean up unresolved tasks in ICOTS.

DOC (DAWN PERSELS)

Dawn stated DOC was still waiting to hear back about notification of sex offender status in care facilities.

KATIE GOTCH - SEX OFFENDER REFERRAL PROCESS

Network discussed different County processes throughout the state.

IMPORTANT ASPECTS OF TREATMENT REFERRALS (see handout):

- Include specific collateral information: ROI, Risk Assessments, Criminal History, PSI, etc.
- Consider “treatment matching”: match the risk/need factors from assessments to providers who specialize w/those characteristics or that population.
- Don’t hand a list of treatment providers to offenders to choose from; they will treatment “shop”.
- Consider O’s responsivity (what makes than an individual?): Mental health, education, language, culture, psychopathic traits, etc.
- How can you deliver the treatment, specific to how they can/will respond?

****Note:** When collecting criminal history info, LEDS and JJIS are not always correct. For correct info, contact OYA or your Juvenile Department.

INFORMATION SHARING: PO’s and Treatment Providers should share treatment plans, progress reports, case plans, assessments, etc.

TREATMENT INTAKE vs. EVALUATION: An intake is a shorter process to identify Risk, Need, Responsivity, and whether or not they are appropriate for treatment; if so, what kind? An evaluation should include aspects of the intake, but should also explore management levels, further assessments and various testing – it’s looking at the much broader picture.

****Note:** Some treatment providers and polygraph examiners agreed that it is not always helpful to have the offender complete a Full Sexual History Disclosure polygraph during the evaluation process, due to lack of preparation.

BEST PRACTICES COMMITTEE - BRENDA CARNEY

Brenda addressed the continued concerns the network has expressed about the inconsistencies with IRT’s throughout the state. OAR’s and the Northwest Regional Transfer Agreement were passed out to the network (see handouts).

- Follow the guidelines in OAR, and disseminate the info throughout the office
- Don’t make up rules as you go.
- The ultimate goal is to have the offender in the best situation; consider supervision for them the same as you would for an offender from your county.

POLYGRAPH MODULE - SETH PROUSER

Seth addressed questions and concerns about the new poly module.

- Abbreviations in module will remain the same re: test result
- You are able to print each offender's individual poly record, but there is not yet an option to run the caseload results.
- There is not a result option for "no-show"; you can either enter as "other" with notes, or enter a chrono.

****Note:** Side discussion about auto-chronos when completing Stable/Acute. Follow up w/Lee Cummins about altering the assessment to NOT make a chrono until it has been "approved", like the Static-99.

BOARD OF PAROLE and POST-PRISON SUPERVISION - DARCEY BAKER

Darcey stated that there has been good change in not listing victims of non-person crimes in the special packages. They found the conditions were not being used, or there were no violations seen on those conditions.

EVIDENCE BASED PRACTICES AND CONDITIONS: State should be looking at criminogenic needs and risk vs. a blanket package for offenders.

PROPOSAL FOR NEW SPECIAL CONDITION: Condition would be based on assessment, and the PO would make directives and referrals. Violations would fall under GC13:

"Offender be assessed and case plan developed to address criminogenic needs."

- Discussion as to whether this would REQUIRE the LSCMI to be completed on SO's.
- **LSCMI vs. Stable/Acute:** BOTH are valid for SO's – they each assess *specific* risk/needs. Sexual recidivism vs. general criminal recidivism.

SEXUALLY EXPLICIT MATERIAL – WHAT IS IT?: If there is a violation submitted, Darcey clarified that a PO must explain why it is relevant to their deviant sexual arousal.

- Exception: Condition of treatment?
- You may have info from collateral info: Evaluations, assessments, polygraph, etc.
- Use GC13: If you had directed them to follow guidelines of SC6/SC10 (pkg A [e.g]), explain why you gave that directive.

CONSENT TO MODIFY CONDITIONS OF PPS: The Board will only add the *specific* wording you have written on the consent form signed by the offender

DOC FIELD TRIPS: The Board and DOC are identifying offenders incarcerated for 10+ years for "field trips" to the communities in which they will be released, so they will be able to familiarize themselves with the community before their release.

- There is discussion about how to include OYA offenders

"PROTECTING OUR CHILDREN" - ERMA YBARRA (CLATSOP CO)

Clatsop Co. is hosting a presentation by Cory Jewell Jensen of the Center for Behavioral Intervention, on Tuesday, March 15, 2011 (see handout). Registration is \$20.00 per person.

STABLE and ACUTE TRAINING- KATIE GOTCH (MULT CO)

Katie will be facilitating the next round of Stable and Acute training in May (Jackson Co) and October (Umatilla Co.). Specific dates and locations to follow.

- Inter-rater reliability sessions will be in collaboration with SOSN.

EVIDENCE BASED PRACTICES and COLLABORATION - JEFF HANSON (DOC)

Jeff presented information on the importance of utilizing and following EBP and collaboration between PO, community partners, treatment providers, and offenders (see handout).
