

Snake River Correctional Institution



Snake River Correctional Institution (SRCI) is the largest prison in Oregon with just over 3,000 beds. Located five-miles northwest of Ontario Oregon. The facility has several unique features such as a complete corridor system connecting housing, program, and work areas so that adults in custody (AICs) can move from one area to another under all types of weather conditions. The institution sits on 550 acres with over one-million square feet of buildings under roof, and it has a perimeter of 2.2 miles.



Located on the Oregon/Idaho border along the Snake River in the Western Treasure Valley, Ontario is the gateway, from the east to Oregon. The Western Treasure Valley offers several small communities to live in. If city life is more your style, the Treasure Valley is home is Boise, Idaho, and several neighboring cities within 35 – 60 miles from the institution. The area offers pristine outdoor activities, fascinating history, diverse landscape, and friendly people. There is a wide variety of recreational opportunities to experience the enchanting scenery throughout the area, along with a wide array of shopping, entertainment, restaurants, and museums.



Ontario is home to Treasure Valley Community College which provides affordable educational opportunities in a relaxed, pleasant rural setting. Not only do they serve the community, TVCC provides education programs for adults in custody at SRCI. Providing education to approximately 650 students per vear.
