

Compliance Bulletin – Q3 2014

Oregon Private Security & Private Investigator Moral Fitness

The Private Security Certification and Private Investigator Licensing programs are mandated by the Oregon legislature to establish and enforce minimum standards for all private security professionals and private investigators in the state. The minimum standards for each program are defined in Oregon Administrative Rule Divisions 60 & 61.

This quarterly review of applicants and providers who violated those minimum standards is meant to provide insight into the types of disqualifiers that DPSST is seeing in revocation, denial, or suspension of certification and licensure. The following cases are *some* of the circumstances that have resulted in consideration of **revocation, denial or suspension** of certifications and/or licenses by DPSST the last quarter.

The Department continues to ensure that certified private security professionals and private investigators meet the minimum standards established by the legislature.

Unarmed Professional	Discretionary	Applicant stole over 10K in retail merchandise on a stolen credit card while a juvenile. Two years later, while an adult, she was arrested again for shoplifting. Moral Fitness provisions dishonesty, lack of public trust and mistreatment of others.

Unarmed Professional	Emergency Suspension	Provider charged with multiple counts of Felony Aggravated Theft, Theft in the First, Aggravated Identity Theft and Theft of Identity.

Unarmed Professional	Mandatory	Applicant convicted of Robbery 3.

Unarmed Professional	Discretionary	Applicant arrested four times (2 felony arrest, 2 misdemeanor arrests) in the prior 10 years. Disqualified under moral fitness, Lack of Respect for the Laws of this State or Nation.

Unarmed Professional	Discretionary	Provider arrested three times in the prior four years (one felony, 2 misdemeanors) Disqualified under moral fitness, Lack of Respect for the Laws of this State or Nation and Mistreatment of Others.
Unarmed Professional	Discretionary	Applicant was arrested for stealing four winches from a tool retailer. He admitted the theft after stopped by police.

Executive Manager	Civil Penalty Assessed	Executive Manager assessed a civil penalty in the amount of \$1,500 for employing an individual to provide security services without proper certification (flagrant violation).
Owner	Civil Penalty Assessed	Bar owner assessed a civil penalty in the amount of \$1,000 for not having a licensed executive manager
Unarmed Professional	Civil Penalty Assessed	Individual assessed a civil penalty in the amount of \$250 for providing private security services without proper certification.
Supervisory Manager	Civil Penalty Assessed	Manager assessed a civil penalty in the amount of \$1,000 for filling out PS-20's prior to sending in application packets, causing individuals to provide security services without proper certification.
Armed/Unarmed Professional	Civil Penalty Assessed	Individual assessed a civil penalty in the amount of \$1,000 for providing private security services without proper certification and not completing training as required.
Owner	Civil Penalty Assessed	Company owner assessed a civil penalty in the amount of \$2,000 for not employing an executive manager and for employing an individual to provide security services without proper certification.
Former Executive Manager	Civil Penalty Assessed	An expired executive manager employing an individual to provide security services without proper certification. The expired manager providing security services without proper certification and failure to apply for renewal for expired executive manager license and continued to conduct business.
Executive Manager	Civil Penalty Assessed	\$2500 civil penalty for executive manager employment of non-certified security professionals
Executive Manager	Civil Penalty Assessed	\$1000 civil penalty for executive manager employment of non-certified security professionals
Unarmed Instructor	Surrendered Certification	Instructor failed to keep accurate records.
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Executive Manager	Civil Penalty	\$3500 penalty to Executive Manager for employing non-certified security professionals.
Multiple Unarmed Professionals	Surrendered Certifications	Discovered that Individuals did not successfully complete required training.
