Dear Director Shepherd:

As a result of the discovery by the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) and the Oregon Health Authority (OHA) of recent dangerous emissions of metal hazardous air pollutants (HAPs) coming from the Bullseye Glass Company facility (Bullseye) in southeast Portland, pursuant to my authority under ORS 468.115, I directed DEQ on May 19, 2016 to order Bullseye to cease and desist from actions causing such pollution for a period of 10 days. I further directed DEQ and OHA to report back to me prior to the expiration of DEQ's order with their recommendation regarding whether I should order that DEQ's order be renewed.

In a May 26, 2016 follow up letter, attached, DEQ and OHA report that Bullseye's actions demonstrate the conditions that warranted the cease and desist order have not been remedied, and the company has not signed an agreement that limits its use of metal HAPs in a manner that ensures that its emissions will not endanger public health. In the absence of the order's extension, an imminent and substantial risk to public health exists.

I therefore order DEQ to renew on May 29, 2016 the order against Bullseye to cease and desist from actions that may result in such pollution for a period of 10 days. However, if DEQ and OHA concur that any cease and desist order then in effect be rescinded because other legally enforceable requirements are in place to adequately protect the public health, then DEQ shall promptly issue an order rescinding the cease and desist order then in effect.
