Author Spotlight: Celia Pérez



The daughter of a Mexican mother and a Cuban father, Celia is originally from Miami and now lives with her family and a pit bull mix named Bagel in Chicago. In addition to

writing books about lovable weirdos and outsiders, she works as a community college librarian.

The First Rule of Punk by Celia Pérez. DB089161. Twelve-year-old Malu reluctantly moves to Chicago and starts seventh grade with a bang. She violates the dress code with her punk rock aesthetic and spurns the most popular girl in favor of starting a band with kids like herself. For grades 4-7. 2017.

Tumble by Celia Pérez. DB110366.

Before she decides whether to accept her stepfather's proposal of adoption, twelve-year-old Adela Ramírez reaches out to her estranged biological father and the eccentric



extended family of wrestlers she has never met, bringing her closer to understanding the expansive definition of family. For grades 5-8. 2022.

Strange Birds: A Field Guide to Ruffling Feathers by Celia Pérez. DB097010. After Ofelia, Aster, Cat, and Lane fail to persuade a local girls club to change an outdated tradition, they form an alternative group that shakes up their sleepy Florida town. For grades 5-8. 2019.

The best nonfiction picture books are true stories that are well-told, and Annette Bay Pimentel enjoys getting people to tell her their stories. She has published several



picture book biographies and has received many awards, including the 2021 Schneider Family Book Award.

All the Way to the Top: How One Girl's Fight for Americans with Disabilities Changed Everything by Annette Bay Pimentel. BR 24705. DB104007. Lifelong activist Jennifer Keelan-Chaffins, born with cerebral palsy and determined to enact change in the world, participated in the Capitol Crawl, a powerful rally to make sure the Americans with Disabilities Act passed in Congress. nothing. It always starts somewhere.
Discover how music is made in this

Girl Running: Bobbi Gibb and the Boston Marathon by Annette Bay Pimentel. DBC12560. This is the inspiring story of the first female to run

the Boston Marathon.
Because Bobbi Gibb is a girl, she is not allowed to run on her school's track team. She bravely sets out to prove the naysayers wrong and show the world just



what a girl can do. For grades K-3.

Author Spotlight: Kwame Alexander


A poet, educator, producer, #1 New York Times bestselling author of 39 books, and recipient of numerous book awards, Kwame



Alexander does it all! He writes children's picture books, middle grade novels, YA novels, love poems, plays, and TV scripts, including *The Crossover* TV series, based on his Newbery-Medal winning novel of the same name, which premiered on Disney+ in April 2023.
