STIPULATED FINAL ORDER

Pursuant to ORS 675.745, the proposed revocation of licensure came before the Board of Licensed Professional Counselors and Therapists (Board) as the result of an investigation into the conduct of Susan G. Dreyer (Dreyer).

Pursuant to ORS 183.415(5) and OAR 833-050-0030, in order to informally dispose of and settle this matter, Dreyer and the Board, by and through its Administrator make the following statements:

1.

Dreyer admits and stipulates that she has been advised of her right to a hearing in the matter of the Board's proposed revocation of her license pursuant to ORS 183.415(2)(a) and to be represented at a hearing pursuant to ORS 183.415(3).

2.

Dreyer waives her right to such a hearing and waives the right to be represented at a hearing by an attorney.

3.

Dreyer waives any and all civil claim or action against the Board, staff, or representatives relating to this matter.

4.

The Board and Dreyer stipulate to the following: That the Board has jurisdiction, and the right to revoke a license if the Board were to prove that a licensee violated statute or one or more of the rules of the Board, specifically ORS 675.745(1)(d) and OAR 833-60-001.

5.

The Board, following an investigation, is concerned that sufficient credible evidence exists to indicate misconduct by Dreyer. The Board alleges that Ms. Dreyer:

(A) Expressed attraction to and attempted to establish non-work related, social relationships with supervisees, who considered her actions sexual advances.

(B) Yelled at, postured in a threatening manner, and in one instance threw an umbrella across the room in the presence of a client.

(C) Was unfamiliar with current therapeutic theory and used a pattern of coercion followed by pleasantries, failed to provide referrals when in the best interest of client, and failed to seek appropriate professional assistance with her own problems that were likely to impair her work.

(D) Shared confidential information disclosed by a supervisee with other counselors.

6.

Dreyer hereby states that:

(A) She never attempted to seduce a co-worker or supervisee, she regrets any misperception that her behavior was seductive.

(B) She is not abusive or selective in the treatment of clients, that she is well within the conventional treatment modalities taught in the addictions field and believes she has a track record of making referrals.

(C) She has participated in extra continuing education and had two extra consultants in addition to supervision at Addictions Recovery Association. She has continuously sought personal growth, working with consultants, within the 12 step process as a recovering person, attended 5-6 AA meetings a week, worked with a sponsor, attended Alanon when needed, and sites eight years of professional psychotherapy in her lifetime.

(E) She admits she did show anger, toss an umbrella down in front of a client, but denies being out of control or overly angry.

(F) She admits she did violate the trust of a supervisee by disclosing confidential information with other counselors.

7.

The Board and Dreyer agree that this matter may be concluded by the entry of this Stipulation on the following terms:

(A) Dreyer hereby resigns her license as a professional counselor. She will refrain from using the initials LPC or indicating in any manner that she is licensed as a counselor. She will submit her 1998-99 license document and her wall certificate within 90 days from the effective date of this order.

(B) Dreyer agrees that she will not make application to the Board for licensure for at least five years from the effective date of this Order.

(C) Dreyer agrees that should she seek licensure from the Board, she agrees that the Board has the authority to deny any such application if, following a contested case hearing, any of the above allegations were proven true. In addition, she agrees that the Board, in considering her application, would require that she document meeting the current standards in place at time of application, and agrees to full re-examination.

(E) The Board accepts the resignation of licensure by Susan G. Dreyer while facing proposed disciplinary action.

8.

If the Board finds, after a contested case hearing, that Dreyer has materially violated any of the terms of this stipulation, the violation shall constitute grounds for revocation of license.


