

OREGON FORMULARY AND JURISPRUDENCE BLUEPRINT

BOTH EXAMS ARE OPEN BOOK AND QUESTIONS ARE MULTIPLE CHOICE

Although these are called “open book” examinations, you do need to review the Oregon Revised Statutes, Oregon Administrative Rules and know your responsibility as a Mandatory reporter.

OREGON FORMULARY EXAMINATION

(1½ hours is allowed to answer 35 questions)

The Formulary examination encompasses Oregon Administrative Rule Chapter 850, Division 60. This division covers the rules governing the training required to offer certain injections, what drugs are not within the scope of practice for naturopathic physicians, DEA registration requirements, and the classification of drugs that can be prescribed. Although this examination is open book, you will need to read and understand this division well enough to practice in Oregon. The formulary test is provided for this purpose. Not every resource book will have every drug/correct answer listed. Questions are multiple choice with one most correct answer. Questions may ask you to determine what the best descriptive use of a drug is, or provide you with a patient case scenario in which you must decide what would be most appropriate from the choices.

*During the exam you will be provided a current copy of Division 60 and you may use **one** reference book of your choice. You need to bring your own reference book; these are not provided for during the exam. You should choose the book that you feel the most comfortable working with. Laptops, palm-pilots, or other hand-held computers are not allowed. No other notes or resources are allowed.*

OREGON JURISPRUDENCE EXAMINATION

(1 hour is allowed to answer 25 questions)

For the Jurisprudence section of the examination you need to review the following documents

Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS) Chapter 685

Oregon Administrative Rules (OAR) Chapter 850

Oregon Laws on Mandatory Reporting: Communicable Disease; Elder Abuse; Child Abuse

Questions are multiple choice and require you to be familiar with ORS 685 – the laws (ORS 685) are amended with approval from the Legislature; and OAR 850 – the rules (OAR 850) are amended by the Board and approved by licensees. Emphasis is on license requirements and restrictions, continuing education, grounds for discipline, responsibilities and definitions. The reporting laws and rules on Communicable Diseases are ORS 433 and OAR 333; for Elder Abuse refer to ORS 124; and for Child Abuse reporting reference 419b. Copies of the most current version are available at <http://www.oregon.gov/obnm/Pages/ORSOAR.aspx>.

During this exam, you will be given a copy of the current statutes and rules to use during the exam. These will be the only documents allowed for use during this exam. Mandatory reporting documents will not be available but questions may be asked pertaining to your responsibility to report. It is suggested that applicants carefully read ORS 685 and OAR 850, review public health laws and know reportable communicable diseases. Although this is an open book examination, you need to review the statute and rules, and other materials given to you before taking this exam.
