) SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT AND

The Board of Naturopathic Examiners (Board) is the state agency responsible for licensing, regulating the practice of naturopathic medicine in the State of Oregon. Janna Redding (Applicant) has applied for examination and licensure as a naturopathic physician.

The Board conducted a background investigation of Applicant. Upon completion of its investigation, the Board finds it has grounds to issue a Notice of Proposed Disciplinary Action regarding the Application. Applicant would be provided the opportunity to request a hearing on such a Notice. In lieu thereof, the parties wish to resolve this matter informally, without any hearing, appeal or judicial review, by entering this Settlement Agreement and Consent Order, pursuant to ORS 183.417(3). This Settlement Agreement and Consent Order is the final resolution of this matter, including the right to any hearing, appeal, or judicial review.

SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

Applicant and the Board stipulate to the following:

1. On April 18 2012, Applicant drove a vehicle in Multnomah County, Oregon while intoxicated, during which time she ran her vehicle into a parked car and a tree. Applicant was arrested on charges of driving under the influence of intoxicants (DUII), reckless driving, and criminal mischief. Applicant submitted to a breathalyzer test, which indicated her blood alcohol concentration was .26. Applicant entered a guilty plea in Case No. 12-04-44654 on May 23, 2012 to the DUII charge as part of a one-year diversion agreement, which requires that Applicant do the following to have the charge dropped:

- 1 a) Attend an alcohol/drug evaluation;
- 2 b) Pay diversion fees;
- 3 c) Complete a treatment program;
- 4 d) Not drive intoxicated;
- 5 e) Attend a victim panel;
- 6 f) Update address;
- 7 g) Complete DUII diversion program;
- 8 h) Install ignition interlock device if driving;
- 9 i) Write letters of apology to three individuals;
- 10 j) Execute a Property Replacement Agreement; and
- 11 k) Complete 40 hours of community service with an agency that deals with the
- 12 consequences of driving under the influence.

13 2. Applicant represents that this incident was an isolated event and that she does not
14 habitually use alcohol or drugs. Applicant's alcohol and drug evaluation, completed as part of
15 her diversion program, indicates that she does not have a substance abuse disorder.

16 3. The Board has grounds to deny the application under ORS 670.280(2) or (3), and
17 ORS 685.110(6), (7) or (14).

18 4. The Board may impose the discipline set forth in this Order.

19 5. Applicant is responsible for all costs incurred to comply with this Order.

20 6. Applicant acknowledges that Applicant has read, understands, and agrees to the terms
21 of this Order. Applicant waives all rights to hearing, appeal or other legal challenge to this Order.

22 7. The parties acknowledge that this Order is a public document.

23 8. The effective date of this Order is the date it is signed by the Board.

24 **ORDER**

25 The Board issues the following order:


- 26 1. The Board shall issue a license to practice naturopathic medicine;

1 2. Once licensed, Applicant shall be on probation for a period of 2 years during which
2 time Applicant must comply with the following conditions:


- 3 a) Attend counseling sessions with a Board-approved licensed professional counselor or
4 therapist, psychologist or psychiatrist ("counselor") to address the incidents described
5 in the stipulated facts above and resolve underlying issues. Applicant shall attend a
6 counseling session at least once per quarter during the probationary period, for a total
7 of at least 8 sessions. Applicant shall arrange to have her counselor submit a
8 summary report at the end of each quarterly session to the Board.
- 9 b) Complete 12 hours of board-approved continuing education or coursework on the
10 subject of stress management;
- 11 c) Complete the terms of diversion that Applicant is subject to in Multnomah County
12 Circuit Court No. 12-04-44654; and
- 13 d) Comply with the statutes, rules and orders of the Board. Violation of this Order, ORS
14 Chapter 685 or OAR Chapter 850 shall be grounds for further discipline, including
15 license revocation, by this Board.
