FINAL ORDER BY DEFAULT

BRYAN J. SCOTT, N.D.,
Licensee.

On October 7, 1999, a notice stating that the Board Oregon Board of Naturopathic Examiners (Board) intended to propose disciplinary action was served upon licensee, Bryan J. Scott, by certified mail. This notice alleged that Licensee engaged in repeated conduct contrary to recognized standards of ethics of the profession by engaging in sexual conduct with two females under the age of sixteen. The notice granted to Licensee an opportunity for a hearing. Licensee had 21 days from the date of service of mailing of the notice to request a hearing. No such request for hearing has been received by the Board. The notice designated the contents of the Board's file regarding this matter as the record for purposes of default.

THEREFORE, after consideration of the records and files of the Board relating to this matter, the Board enters the following Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Bryan J. Scott is licensed by the Board to practice as a naturopathic physician in the State of Oregon.

2. Licensee engaged in sexual conduct during the year 1982 with S.F., who was between eleven and twelve years old, on five or six occasions over a two-month period.

1 2. Licensee is to remain in treatment with a psychologist or psychiatrist specializing in
2 the treatment of sexual offenders, approved by the Board, as set forth by the Oregon Board of
3 Chiropractic Examiners, until such time as the treating psychologist or psychiatrist and a second
4 evaluating psychologist or psychiatrist jointly determine that no further treatment of Licensee is
5 warranted.

6 3. Licensee shall request the treating psychologist or psychiatrist to submit quarterly
7 reports to the Board regarding Licensee's progress. Such reports shall be submitted prior to the
8 15th day of the months of January, April, July and October of each year, for as long as Licensee
9 remains in treatment. Licensee waives any privilege and consents to allow contact between the
10 treating psychologist or psychiatrist and the Board for verifying compliance with the terms and
11 conditions of this Order.

13 4. Upon completion of treatment, Licensee must continue to have the treating
14 psychologist or psychiatrist report on a quarterly basis to the Board. The report must include the
15 results of a polygraph, or other testing approved by the Board, to provide evidence of continued
16 non-offending behavior.

18 5. Licensee must abide by any and all restrictions placed upon him by Services for
19 Children and Families.

20 6. Licensee must never be alone with a minor in his naturopathic office.


21 7. The Board or it's representative is authorized to enter Licensee's business premises
22 for the period of probation to examine, review and photocopy Licensee's patient or other records
23 to determine compliance with the terms of probation.
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1 8. If at any time within the probationary period Licensee violates the conditions of
2 probation Licensee's license may be revoked made effective immediately under ORS 685.110
3 and OAR 850-010-0190(3).

4 9. A permanent limitation is imposed prohibiting Licensee from treating minors under
5 ORS 685.110.

6 10. Should Licensee violate the permanent limitation in paragraph 9, Licensee's license
7 may be revoked made effective immediately under ORS 685.110 and OAR 850-010-0190(3).


Re: Board Action- Addendum to Final Order by Default in case N99-03-01
