



## Reinstating Your Oregon License to Practice Optometry

If you were previously licensed as a doctor of optometry in Oregon, you may have your license reinstated if you were in good standing (see OAR 852-050-0014, below) at the time you voluntarily surrendered your license or it was suspended for nonpayment of the license renewal or late fee(s).

To reinstate your Oregon license to Active Status:

- Contact the Board's office at (503) 399-0662, ext. 1, or by e-mail to [cathy.boudreau@oregon.gov](mailto:cathy.boudreau@oregon.gov) to determine how long you have been unlicensed in Oregon and learn the total of your delinquent fees (the annual fees for those years your license was invalid and a late fee for the first year you let your license lapse) and what continuing education requirements apply.
- Pass the Oregon Optometric Law and Administrative Rules examination (if it has been more than two years since you held an active status license in Oregon). You can find and take the examination online at any time through the National Board of Examiners in Optometry at: <http://www.optometry.org/law.cfm>.
- Have each state in which you have ever been licensed to practice optometry send a written license verification and status update directly to the Oregon Board of Optometry, 1500 Liberty Street SE, Suite 210, Salem, Oregon 97302.
- Submit your signed request for reinstatement of licensure to the Board, with the following:
  1. A check for the total of your delinquent fees and the reinstatement fee.
  2. Proof of your current CPR certification, as required in OAR 852-080-0040.
  3. Proof of required continuing education hours.

Once all the elements of your application are in hand and we determine you are eligible for reinstatement, we often can reinstate your status within a day or two. **Note:** We have seen long delays from some states in sending license verifications; you may wish to make your verification requests to other states sooner instead of later to ensure no unnecessary delays.

## **Oregon Administrative Rules**

### **852-050-0014 - Reinstatement of License**

(1) A person who has been previously licensed by the Board may have the license reinstated to its former status if the person:

- (a) Voluntarily surrendered the license to the Board and at the time of so doing was in good standing and not under investigation, notice for proposed disciplinary action, or final order of the Board; or
- (b) The license was suspended due to nonpayment of the license renewal fee or late fee and at the time of suspension was not under investigation, notice for proposed disciplinary action, or final order of the Board.

(2) To reinstate an Oregon optometry license a Doctor of Optometry must:

- (a) Submit a signed Reinstatement Request form;
- (b) Provide confirmation sent directly from the licensing entity of each state in which the applicant has ever been licensed that the applicant for licensure has not been sanctioned for violating the laws, rules or standards of ethics of that jurisdiction. In addition, the Board will query the National Practitioner Data Bank and the Healthcare Integrity and Protection Data Bank for adverse actions on each person making an application of licensure.
- (c) Pass any required criminal records background check;
- (d) Pay delinquent fees as determined by the Board;
- (e) Pay the reinstatement fee of \$100; and
- (f) Submit documentation of current CPR certification, as required in OAR 852-080-0040, if licensed to use Nontopical TPAs.
- (g) The requirements in (2)(b) and (2)(e) above may be waived by the Board if the license is not more than 60 days expired.

(3) Reinstatement of a license to active status also requires:

- (a) Passage of the Oregon optometric law and administrative rules examination if it has been more than two years since the person held an active status license in Oregon; and
- (b) Submission of continuing education hours equivalent to Oregon requirements for the previous license renewal period.

### **852-080-0040 (2); (3) - Certification to Use Pharmaceutical Agents: CPR Certification**

The CPR certification shall be the American Heart Association's BLS Healthcare Providers Course or its equivalent, as determined by the Board. This CPR course shall be a hands-on course; online CPR courses will not be approved by the Board for initial CPR certification. A CPR certification card with an expiration date must be received from the CPR provider. The Board shall consider the CPR expiration date to be the last day of the month that the CPR instructor indicates that the certification expires.
