Subject:	appointment to the Oregon Coordinating Council on Ocean Acidification and Hypoxia (OAH)

Background:

The State Board of Agriculture, in consultation with the Governor, is responsible for appointing one member to the Oregon Coordinating Council on Ocean Acidification and Hypoxia (OAH) representing the shellfish mariculture industry per <u>ORS 196.571</u>.

The OAH Council represent industries that are currently and potentially impacted by acidification and hypoxia in Oregon. The state was one of the first places in the world to observe the direct impacts of ocean acidification. Acidification, the increase in carbon levels in water which threatens marine life, continues to challenge oyster aquaculture productivity and has caused some producers to move operations elsewhere. Also, of great concern, hypoxia events. Hypoxia refers to low oxygen in the water.

The 13-member council is responsible for providing recommendations and guidance to the State of Oregon on how to respond to direct impacts of ocean acidification.

OAH Council Members include:

- Governor or Governor's designee;
- OSU Director or Director's designee;
- State Fish & Wildlife Director or designee;
- The Director of Agriculture or designee;
- Director of the Department of Environmental Quality or designee;
- Director of Land Conservation and Development or designee;
- Remaining 7 members are appointed in consultation with the Governor's office including one member representing the shellfish mariculture (the cultivation of fish or other marine life for food) industry, appointed by the State Board of Agriculture.

The shellfish mariculture industry position has been vacant for approximately one-year as we have recruited interested candidates for the position. The former industry representative Liu Xin, who served on the Council since 2013, stepped down from this position at the end of 2019. Alex Manderson, ODA's shellfish specialist participates in the Council as the Director's designee.

The term of each member is 4 years. A member is eligible for re-appointment.

Over the past 6 years as an operator in the seafood industry I have witnessed and share in the struggles of small seafood operators, as well as observed challenges experienced by buyers of local seafood. Various factors account for these struggles, some of which are avoidable on the front end during policy development. Environmental factors are an unavoidable, sensitive and challenging topic which concern me greatly.

I am capable of reading and understanding scientific data as well as economic statistics and forecasts, and integrating these sources of information to inform potential policy outcomes. I am particularly suited for this because my approach to addressing operational challenges has always been both solving the visceral on-theground logistical issues, but also being engaged in forethought about development of our industry as described in my work experience below.

My professional experience, though small scale, spans the entire economic seafood value-chain; from harvesting, processing, storage/distribution, sales, restaurant ownership/buyer experience as well as being an "ultimate consumer" myself. Over the past 6 years I have built a small seafood business, Blue Siren Shellfish, where I continue to gain experience securing and maintaining a variety of harvest and buyer/ seller permits.

I have solid working relationships with other wild harvesters and oyster farmers as well as chefs and buyers of Oregon mariculture products. Additionally, I have worked with the Port of Garibaldi over the past few years on their Seafood Value Chain Initiative, co-authoring reports and assessments on behalf of Columbia Pacific Economic Development District. As part of this I helped design and implement outreach efforts which have included surveys, interviews and focus groups discussions with seafood producers including mariculture operators. This experience has provided a lot of insight into our local seafood business community and will allow me to represent a wide variety of perspectives.
