OSAS Professional Development Opportunity: ELA and Mathematics Summative Test Scoring

The Oregon Department of Education (ODE) is seeking educators interested in participating in the scoring of ELA and Mathematics test items for Oregon Statewide Summative Tests.

- This training is primarily intended for individuals who would like to deepen their understanding of hand-scored items and the rubrics used to score them.
- Recruited applicants will be signed on as temporary employees with ODE and Measurement Incorporated and will receive compensation at the standard ODE rate of \$28.96 per hour.
- Applicants will need to apply for either ELA or mathematics scoring.

NOTE: There are minimum technical requirements to install and run the scoring platform. *For instance, the scoring platform <u>does</u> <u>not</u> run properly on ChromeOS.*

The initial training for this project will occur on March 17, 2023, in Salem, OR. Substitute and travel costs for the March 17 training day will be covered by ODE.

Following that training day, qualified raters will then remotely score items during their own off-contract time throughout spring.

ODE will prioritize selection based on educator and regional diversity, active classroom educators and instructional coaches, grade band scoring needs, and a combination of both new and experienced scoring experience.

The deadline for submitting an <u>application</u> is **Thursday, February 9, 2023** and ODE will notify successful applicants by February 13, along with information on next steps.

Alt ELPA User Guide and Training Materials Now Available

All required Test Administrator (TA) training materials, including an <u>Alt ELPA User Guide</u>, are now available for the Alternate English Language Proficiency Assessment (Alt ELPA). Both District Test Coordinators (DTCs) and TAs must review these required training materials prior to any administration of the Alt ELPA.

The complete list of required training elements for the Alt ELPA includes:

- Foundational training materials for the DTC or TA role, as outlined in the <u>Test Administration Manual</u> section 1.5
- <u>Alt ELPA User Guide</u>: contains step-by-step instructions on how to access and administer the test

The Alt ELPA User Guide refers to Alt ELPA TA Directions and Scoring Rubrics Booklets, retrieved from the General Resources pulldown in the Test Information Delivery Engine (TIDE). These booklets are being finalized and will be made available to states soon. They contain reproductions of Alt ELPA items and scoring rubrics specific to those items, and are therefore secure materials. The booklets are not a training material. They can be downloaded at any time prior to testing.

The Collaborative for the Alternate Assessment of English Language Proficiency (CAAELP) has created optional (but highly recommended) TA and DTC training slides, accessible via the <u>ELPA21 training site</u>. These slides contain contextual information about the purpose of the Alt ELPA, as well as administration, accessibility, and security considerations. Note that the information in these vendor-created slides has not been customized for Oregon.

- Oregon Accessibility Manual (OAM): Alt ELPA test supports reviewed and harmonized
