Just Released: Arts, Care & Connection K-5 Pilot Lessons!

Arts for Learning Northwest is collaborating with Oregon teaching artists on the development of a series of four arts courses designed for K-5 students called <u>Arts, Care & Connection</u>, with integrated social emotional learning content in the areas of dance, visual arts, theater, and music. This lesson is part of a pilot project, and will be



shared in its final version in an Oregon Open Learning Lesson Collection. Oregon teachers are encouraged to provide feedback on the form included in the lesson resources, to inform the development of this project.

The <u>Oregon Open Learning Hub</u> is a digital resource repository and collaboration space for educators, administrators, and other educational partners to curate, create, and remix open educational resources (OER). # Well-Rounded Access Program (WRAP) Native Arts Project Updates

The Well-Rounded Access Program is excited to announce a project to increase access to arts learning through culturally responsive lessons about contemporary and regional Native artists! This work aims to boost access to accurate, Tribal-specific arts content for Native and non-Native students through partnerships with <u>federally recognized Tribes</u>, Southern Oregon ESD, and the <u>Jim Pepper Native Arts Council</u>. They will develop lessons and professional development sessions integrating local Tribal cultural practices and the work of contemporary Native artists, incorporating the <u>Oregon Arts Standards</u> and the <u>9 Essential Understandings</u> (developed for the <u>Tribal History/Shared History (TH/SH) project</u>).

These lessons will not replace the lessons mandated under Senate Bill 13 and Tribal History/Shared History, but rather, provide supplemental resources to reinforce these important concepts within arts education spaces.

# Main Objectives:

- To increase the use of culturally responsive teaching practices and deeper, more specific knowledge sharing around the arts and cultural practices of Tribes and Indigenous peoples across the state
- To ensure that AI/AN students are represented in the content that they engage with in all subjects in school, in alignment with the <u>AI/AN Student Success Plan</u>
- To honor the cultural practices of local Tribes and increase awareness around the diversity and depth of Tribal cultural practices through education around the 9 Essential Understandings and Oregon Arts Standards

Challenge America offers support primarily to small organizations for projects that extend the reach of the arts to underserved groups/communities. The program is rooted in principles that include, but are not limited to, our recognition that:



• Some groups/communities and some geographic

areas with rich and dynamic artistic and cultural identities have limited grant funding opportunities, and/or have been historically underserved by national arts funding;

- Some small organizations may face barriers to accessing grant funding; and
- Some applicants to the NEA may benefit from enhanced technical assistance resources.

Challenge America seeks to address these potential barriers for organizations seeking funding. Challenge America supports arts projects in many artistic disciplines including Artist Communities, Arts Education, Dance, Design, Folk & Traditional Arts, Literary Arts, Local Arts Agencies, Media Arts, Museums, Music, Musical Theater, Opera, Presenting & Multidisciplinary Arts, Theater, and Visual Arts.
