

Topic: Summer Meals Outreach

Overview:

School Food Authorities (SFAs) are required to promote the USDA summer meal programs, the Summer Food Service Program (SFSP), and the Seamless Summer Option (SSO). The goal of promoting both programs is to ensure that low-income children continue to receive nutritious meals when school is not in session.

Requirements:

- Conduct summer meal programs outreach before the end of the school year to ensure that families are informed of the availability and location of summer meals.
- Outreach includes distributing information on how to find the location, meal times, and contact information through regular communication channels.

Summer School Meals and Meal Service Options:

- School Districts offering any type of academic, enrichment, or remedial program during the summer months at qualifying sites, must offer a meal program.
 - Qualifying site: those sites that have ≥50% of the children enrolled during the regular school year who qualify for free and reduced price meals.
- The meal service must be open to all children in the community, as well as the summer school students.

Outreach Options:

- Post information on your web site
- Send a flyer home with students
- Post a message on your reader board
