Why an Adaptive Management Program (AMP)?

- Required by Private Forest Accord and associated statute
- Necessary for Habitat Conservation Plan


AMP Purpose per Rule

- a) Ensure timely & effective change as needed to meet biological goals and objectives;
- b) Provide predictability & stability of changing regulation so landowners, regulators, & the public can understand and anticipate change;
- c) Apply best available science to decision-making;
- d) Effectively meet biological goals and objectives with less operationally expensive prescriptions when feasible.

Reminder: Adaptive Management different than Compliance Monitoring
