Subject: New training reimbursement program funded by American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA)

The Office of Developmental Disabilities has launched a new training reimbursement program. This program will reimburse registration and subscription costs for trainings relevant to supporting people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD). ODDS Medicaid agency providers, foster care providers and independent contractors who provide ODDS services are eligible for these reimbursements.

The total budget for this program is \$200,000 from ODDS' American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds.

This ODDS transmittal includes information of how to apply for reimbursement and qualifying training expenses. Pre-approval of training reimbursements is required. The <u>application</u> for pre-approval opened on April 1 and closes on Dec. 31, 2024 or until funding runs out. All training and reimbursement submissions must be completed by March 1, 2025 through a simple reporting process.

We hope this program will help providers, foster care providers and independent contractors access important training to continue providing critical services as effectively as possible.
