EMAC 2022 – 2025 Work Plan

- **Toll Projects:** Coordination with toll project teams to strategize technical analysis, engagement, and mitigation.
- Low-Income Toll Program and Rulemaking: Coordinated recommendations on rules for customer service, low-income programming, and rate schedule.
- Accountability: Annual workshops with ODOT to deep dive into equity recommendations to sustain accountability and advance equity.

EMAC's OTC Recommendation Guiding Questions

Per EMAC's Recommendations to the OTC (July 2022):

- Rate: What is the toll rate and the relative cost burden across aggregated demographic populations?
- Revenue: How and where is the toll revenue invested?
- Responsibility: Who is responsible for long-term oversight and adjustments of the toll program? How will those responsible demonstrate transparency and accountability?





Rate Setting

EMAC will provide **recommendations to STRAC** to shape the following areas of their work plan:

- Rule development customer interaction
- Rule development rate setting process
- Engagement activities relating to rule development





Revenue

EMAC will provide **recommendations to RTAC** to shape rules and guidelines to ensure equitable revenue allocation:

- Shaping priorities and balancing trade-offs
- Developing frameworks and metrics for prioritization





Responsibility

EMAC will provide **input to ODOT** about how to build accountability within the Oregon Toll Program (OTP). Some themes for accountability include:

- Turning recommendations into sustainable commitments
- Developing oversight systems to ensure long-term equitable outcomes
- Demonstrating transparency and accountability to historically and currently excluded and underserved communities.



ODOT Accountability Workshops


ODOT workshops will be held in July 2023 and July 2024 to focus on turning EMAC's recommendations into a work plan.

Oregon Highway Plan Toll Amendment

- Oregon Highway Plan (OHP) incorporated language from EMAC's 2022 recommendations to OTC.
- OHP Toll Amendment was our first look at a process of accountability, with ODOT reporting on how EMAC's recommendations were incorporated into decision-making processes and documents.
- The OTC adopted the OHP Toll Amendment during their meeting on January 12th, 2023.





RMPP Indicators

- Reviewed proposed indicators for RMPP NEPA analysis
- Discussed quantitative and qualitative data availability
- EMAC members shared input for developing qualitative study methods to analyzing impacts on historically excluded and underserved communities
- EMAC Members to provide feedback by February 8th





I-205 Draft Environmental Assessment

- 45-day comment period: TBD
- Invite feedback on the findings of the draft Environmental Assessment.
- Online engagement to include webinar and virtual public hearing.
- In-person engagement to include community drop-in sessions, in-language outreach, and discussion groups (more on next slide).
- Briefings available for community organizations; let us know of any potential briefing opportunities for organizations you work with!





I-205 Draft Environmental Assessment

- In-person engagement opportunities:
 - Meeting people where they are at places like grocery stores, community centers
 - Do you have other ideas of where we could meet people with project information?
- Coordination with equitable engagement project partners:
 - In-language discussion groups
 - In-language information sharing online and at community events
 - Discussion group with community-based organizations





Regional Mobility Pricing Project: Scoping Comment Period

- 50-day comment period: Nov. 18, 2022 Jan. 6, 2023.
- Invited feedback on Draft Purpose and Need, Proposed Action, and topics to study in the Environmental Assessment.
- Approximately **4,500** public comments received.
- 100 participants at public webinars and dozens of community and agency conversations.
- Webinar topics of interest: minimizing rerouting, low-income discounts, specifics of how tolling and toll payment will work, funding, and I-205 Toll Project.

Regional Mobility Pricing Project: Next Steps

- Ongoing review of public comments and draft report to summarize what we heard.
- Consider input received during scoping prior to conducting analyses for the Environmental Assessment.
- Ongoing public updates and engagement.
- Publish Draft Environmental Assessment in late 2023 for public review and comment.







Low-Income Toll Program

- Briefing provided to the Oregon Legislature Joint Committee on Transportation
- Developing work plan for State Toll Rule Advisory Committee (STRAC) to inform EMAC and STRAC involvement
- Working with back-office operations teams to prepare options for further analysis and discussion this spring-summer
