Traumatic brain injury (TBI), can result when the head suddenly and violently hits an object, or when an object pierces the skull and enters brain tissue. Symptoms of a TBI can be mild, moderate, or severe, depending on the extent of the damage to the brain. A person with a mild or moderate TBI may remain conscious or may experience a loss of consciousness for a few seconds or minutes.

If you believe you are experiencing symptoms of Traumatic Brain Injury, contact the Oregon Department of Veterans' Affairs today and ask to make an appointment with a veterans service officer. You may be entitled to compensation and/or medical care that can help make a difference.
