
What is a Designation?


 "Designation" refers to the designation of a Health Professional Shortage Area (HPSA)

Why are Designations Important?

- A) They are a way of analyzing health care access (or lack of access) for:
 - All the people in a geographic area (geographic designation)
 - Example: Morrow County
 - A particular population in an area:
 - Low Income (under 200% of poverty level) Example: Coos County
 - Migrant and Seasonal Farmworkers Example: Wasco County
 - Homeless Individuals Example: Jackson County
 - Medicaid Eligible Populations No examples in Oregon currently
 - A certain type of facility
 - Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC)
 - Some Rural Health Clinics
 - Penitentiaries—federal, and state maximum and medium


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


Oregon Primary Medical Care Health Professional Shortage Area (HPSA) Designations as of 1/22/2013



Oregon Dental Care Health Professional Shortage Area (HPSA) Designations as of 1/22/2013




Oregon Mental Care Health Professional Shortage Area (HPSA) Designations as of 1/22/2013




Level of Need Connected to a Score

- Higher the score, higher the perceived or assessed need


Oregon Primary Medical Care Health Professional Shortage Area (HPSA) Designations and Scores

Factors Used to Designate Differ Among Disciplines

Medical:

- Population to Provider Ratio
- Poverty Level (under 100% of FPL)
- Travel time to nearest non-designated provider
- Low Birthweight/Infant Mortality Rate

Dental:

Substitutes fluoridation of water supply for LBW/IMR


Mental Health:

 Substitutes prevalence of drug and alcohol abuse for LBW/IMR




Population-to-Provider Ratios: Primary Medical Care

Population-to-Provider Ratios: Primary Mental Health




Why are Designations Important?

- c) HPSA Designations provide access to federal resources
 - Support to increase workforce capacity
 - NHSC LRP and Scholar Placement
 - BCRS NELRP
 - Medicare Bonus Payment in geographical areas to physicians
 - FQHC Funding, RHC Funding, OPCA, others over \$51 million to Oregon in 2011.


National Health Service Corps (NHSC) Placements by County, Q3-2012

Total of 219 participants: 208 - NHSC Loan Repayment Program participants and 11 - NHSC Scholars




Nursing Scholorship Program (NSP)/Nursing Education Loan Repayment Program (NELRP) Placements by County, Q3-2012

Total of 81 participants: 61 - NELRP participants; 7 - NELRP-NF participants; and 13 - NSP participants

Process

- Must update every three years—apply to HRSA
 - PCO Staff use an online tool to identify and submit applications

Data Sources Used:

- Workforce Database
- APAC
- US Census
- Public Health Data

The Future...

- PCO to complete work on 10 new and updated HPSAs by 9/30/13
- New HPSA methodology expected by early 2014—to include PAs and NPs
- New NHSC LRP Cycle opens January 2014
- ...and, potential Medicaid Population Designations
