INSTRUCTIONS

This Assessment Tool for Expanding Systems of Care is designed to assess the implementation of an array of strategies that may be used by communities to sustain existing systems of care (SOCs) and to expand the SOC approach. It is not expected that a site will have used all of the strategies listed below. Rather, each site will employ the mix of strategies deemed most appropriate and effective in their unique context and environment. Further, **this assessment process is not intended to be used as an evaluation**, but as a technical assistance tool for identifying areas of strength and potential opportunities for intervention to expand the SOC approach. The purpose of this tool is to help each community define progress to date and inform statewide collaborative partners on how to be supportive in moving forward. It is intended to measure **"progress"** in implementing each strategy as well as ongoing needs; *it is not expected that a site will report extensive progress in all areas*. Rating progress objectively will enhance the usefulness of this tool in planning and implementing strategies to move further toward expansion of the SOC approach.
