# Community Capacity Building Funds

Resources for community organizations supporting the 1115 Medicaid waiver



Oregon received approval from the federal government to offer new services to Oregon Health Plan (OHP) members called health-related social needs (HRSNs). HRSNs are social and economic needs that are essential to maintain health and well-being. HRSN benefits include climate-related resources, housing supports and nutritional assistance and will be available to OHP members who meet certain criteria. Community Capacity Building Funds (CCBFs) may be available to support HRSN service providers and organizations that will become HRSN providers to develop what they need to be able to participate in the Medicaid system and deliver HRSN services to qualified OHP members.

Oregon is eligible to fund up to \$119 million in capacity building for providers and partners that plan to deliver HRSN services. Coordinated care organizations (CCOs) will administer a majority of CCBF, except for those funds reserved for Tribal Governments. CCOs will be responsible for activities including conducting outreach regarding funding opportunities, receiving and reviewing applications, and awarding funding to eligible entities. Specifics about CCBFs include:

# **CCBF Eligibility**

A variety of organizations may be eligible for CCBFs, including: community-based organizations, patient health navigators, social service agencies, traditional health workers, child welfare providers, government entities with community health workers, and schools.

\*The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) refer to CCBFs as "infrastructure funds"





### Use of CCBFs


These funds can be used for: technology related costs, development of business and operational processes, administrative costs, and outreach and education to OHP members.
