Membership Recruitment:

The Health Equity Committee has opened recruitment, and we plan to solicit new member applications from September 24 to October 17, 2022, to fill current vacancies (2) and four (4) seats that will be vacant in December 2022, when existing members cycle off the committee. These members are Kate Wells, Stick Crosby, and Amela Blekic, who served on the committee for four years; and Sofia Venegas, a member that joined the HEC in December 2021 but will end their commitment earlier (December 2022) due to relocation out of state. *Information about recruitment can be found here:* https://www.oregon.gov/oha/oei/pages/health-equity-committee.aspx.

Committee Work Progress/Status Update (2022 – Quarter 3):

The Health Equity Committee welcomed Sandy Sampson as our new OHPB Liaison.

The Health Equity Committee engaged consultant Michael Anderson-Nathe to support the committee's work in developing a new charter. A progress update of the Health Equity Committee's charter, mission, vision, values, and goals was presented to the Oregon Health Policy Board at their August 2022 meeting.

The Health Equity Committee received updates from Lori Coyner, Senior Medicaid Policy Advisor, on the progress of Oregon's 1115 Medicaid waiver, an effort that received support from the Health Equity Committee. The HEC hosted members of the OHA Policy and Analytics team (Kate Lonborg and Katie Howard) who were seeking input from HEC on how to operationalize the planned changes related to committees that set measures and benchmarks; and in September, welcomed OHA's Dr. Dean Salinger, Health Officer and State Epidemiologist (OHAPH), Christine Rankin, and Dolly England from the OHA Public Health Engagement Unit. They presented an update about OHA's response to hMPXV after some concerns from community partners were received about the potential stigmatization of groups most affected by the hMPXV outbreak.

In October, the HEC will dedicate time to an update from committee staff on the Intersectional Gap Analysis tool to recruit new members. The tool uses quantitative and qualitative data to consider the multiple intersecting identities that current committee members and applicants bring to the table to align its membership and representation even more closely with its health equity mission, identifying not just REALD-SOGI and geographic representation but also critical lived experience and sector expertise. In addition, the HEC will have the opportunity to receive an update from the OHA Government Relations team about the upcoming legislative session.

The HEC will have a retreat on November 1st, 2022, to discuss important aspects of the charter and to develop concrete strategic goals based on the charter's vision, mission, and values statements. Included in that values work is the development of an anti-racism statement that will ground the committee's work in equity and anti-

racism. The committee will dedicate the November HEC meeting to finalizing and approving the charter update presented to OHPB at their December 2022 meeting.

In addition, the committee has opened recruitment. It plans to finalize a new committee member slate in November that can also be presented to OHPB in December for approval.

Membership Recruitment:

Four new members joined the Committee in this last quarter: Manu Chaudhry, MS, DDS, President of Capitol Dental Care; Andrea Ketelhut, PMP, Quality Measures Program Manager of PacificSource; Jorge Ramirez Garcia, PhD, Associate Research Professor, Prevention Science Institute at the University of Oregon; and Courtney Widden-Rivera, MS, CHES, Manager, Medicaid Quality Improvement with EOCCO.

We plan to solicit new member applications in October 2022 for an appointment beginning in January 2023 (single at-large position).

Committee Work Progress/Status Update (2022 - Quarter 3):

- While in Quarter 2 the Committee chose <u>15 measures for inclusion in the 2023 CCO Quality Incentive</u>

 <u>Program</u>, in Quarter 3 it chose a subset of <u>four measures for the Challenge Pool</u>. These Challenge Pool measures are potentially worth additional bonus funds and therefore tend to receive particular attention.
- The Committee also used this time to discuss how to better center equity it its work. This included reviewing a working paper on how equity is incentivized in other Medicaid programs, discussing the caveats of different methods for measuring disparities and inequities, and reviewing preliminary data on performance by race and ethnicity. These conversations will continue and serve to lay the groundwork for the planned program structure changes to make health equity the central organizing principle of the CCO Quality Incentive Program.

Upcoming work and decisions (2022 – Quarter 4)?

The Committee has until the end of the year to choose the benchmarks and targets that CCOs must meet in 2023 to earn bonus funds through the CCO Quality Incentive Program.

This has included reviewing how CCOs performed in 2021, during which performance began to rebound on most measures; how CCOs performed in 2021, during which performance began to rebound on most measures; consideration of public comment voicing concerns about workforce shortages; awareness of the federal rules that allow for incentive payments to CCOs for meaningful quality improvement; and, reviewing the program structure and understanding the impact of different benchmarks and targets.

• The Committee is grappling with (i) how to set targets which will result in meaningful quality improvements for members of the Oregon Health Plan as required by the CMS rules which allow bonus funds to be distributed to CCOs through the program and (ii) the realities of the impact of the pandemic on the ground, including current workforce shortages.

Committee Work Progress/Status Update (2022 - Quarter 3):

The Value-Based Payment VBP Model Development Workgroup met monthly during Q3 to discuss a series of design decisions to develop a primary care VBP model to be completed in Q1 2023. Preliminary recommendations outline a prospective payment model based on services provided, allowing for inclusion of a diverse array of care team members. A performance-based incentive payment is also recommended in the model to reward high performance relative to external benchmarks and improvement over time.

At future meetings this fall the Workgroup will select the specific services to include in the prospective payment, define a set of aligned quality metrics and benchmarks, and discuss and make recommendations about the following components of a primary care VBP model: ensuring equity and protecting against negative consequences; infrastructure payments; state and payer data; technical assistance to support implementation and the removal of administrative barriers.
