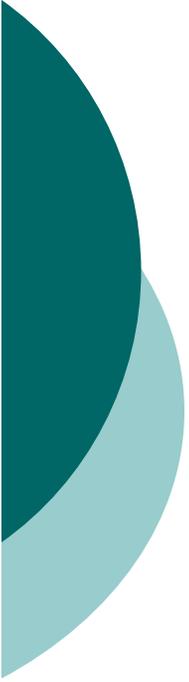

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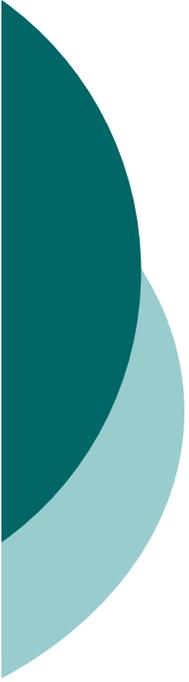

# Background

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
- OHA programs currently service all populations from birth through death. Often participants receive services from multiple areas of the department over their lifetime. Many of these programs are managed and administered independent of each other.
- The OHA vision is to develop comprehensive business, information, and technical architectures that will provide efficiencies through the reuse of systems and programs and by sharing of data between these program areas.
- OHA believes MITA establishes an approach that extends beyond the Medicaid program and creates a business reference model for the state Health and Human Services enterprise.
- OHA will be using the MITA framework and applying its principles to all Health Service Programs. In doing so, the opportunity to serve shared populations with an IT infrastructure that places people at the center of every transaction is now possible.



# What is MITA?

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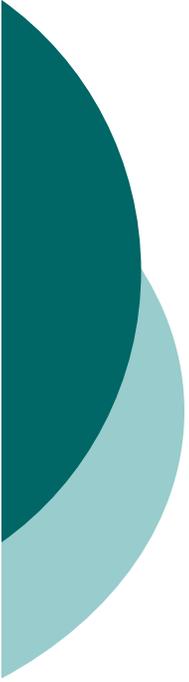
- MITA is a national framework promulgated by the federal Centers for Medicaid and Medicare Services (CMS), that provides guidance to state Medicaid agencies as those agencies seek to improve business operations and supporting information technology.
- CMS issued regulations (CMS 210-0251 & 42 CFR § 433.112) that establish a set of standards and conditions that States must meet in order for Healthcare technology investments to be eligible for the enhanced match funding.
- MITA is intended to foster the integration of business and IT across each state's Medicaid and Healthcare enterprise.
- The MITA initiative includes an architecture framework, processes, and planning guidelines for enabling states Medicaid and Healthcare enterprises to meet common objectives within the framework while supporting unique local needs.



# State Self-Assessment

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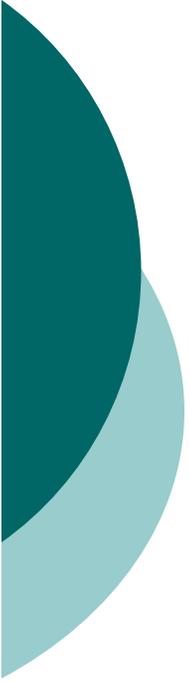
- Our Federal partners (CMS) wants Oregon to conduct a State Self-Assessment to determine our current business capabilities and document our plans for transformation to achieve higher efficiencies through a strategic plan. This plan will look at the next 10 years.
- We will be looking at “common” healthcare business processes throughout OHA. This will help OHA determine their strategic plan.



# What is MITA changing?

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- MITA does not change current programs, business processes or implements a “new system.”
- We are simply conducting a state self-assessment which will consist of documenting business processes and developing an OHA strategic plan for the next 10 years.
