## **MEDICAL MARIJUANA INFORMATION BULLETIN 2018-02**

**Subject: Grower Tracking and Reporting Compliance** 

The Oregon Medical Marijuana Program (OMMP) is responsible for collecting and analyzing reports that track medical marijuana transfers and onsite inventory. Most registered medical marijuana growers are required to submit monthly transfer and inventory reports to the OMMP. Reports are due by the 10<sup>th</sup> of each month for the previous month's transfers and inventory.

Reporting is done through the <u>Oregon Medical Marijuana Online System</u> (OMMOS). Growers (except growers exempt as outlined below) are currently required to report monthly transfers and onsite inventory in OMMOS. This includes any growers and grow sites that will be required to use the Cannabis Tracking System (CTS) when it is up and running. **If growers do not start reporting monthly into OMMOS as required, they will risk having their registration revoked.**

## **Outline of Reporting Requirements**

## **Exempt from Tracking and Reporting**

All items indicated below must be true for a grower to be exempt from all reporting and tracking requirements.

- You are a patient only growing for yourself at your residence; AND
- There are no more than 12 mature plants and 24 immature plants being grown at the grow site; AND
- Not transferring to a medical processor or dispensary.

## **OMMOS Reporting**

If any one of the following are true, you must submit monthly reports into OMMOS:

- I am named as a grower for a patient other than myself.
- I am growing at a grow site address that is not the patient's residence.
- I am selling excess usable medical marijuana, seeds or immature plants to OHA processors or dispensaries.
- I am a patient growing for myself and transferring excess marijuana to OHA processors or dispensaries.

- I am growing at a grow site that indicated through the SB 1057 election form process
  that the grow site will transition over to OLCC and an application has been submitted
  to OLCC before January 1, 2018. Tracking in OMMOS must continue until the OLCC
  application has been approved and you are set up in the CTS tracking system.
  - Note: If the grow site application submitted to OLCC is considered incomplete
    or is issued a proposed denial, that grow site will be required to sign up to use
    CTS with OMMP within 30 days from being notified of the OLCC determination,
    once CTS is implemented.
- I am growing at a grow site address where there are more than 12 mature plants.

If you are at a grow site with over 12 plants and are staying with the OMMP, you will be notified by the OMMP when and how to begin reporting using the CTS. Until that time, you must continue to submit monthly tracking and inventory reports in OMMOS, even if you did not have any transfers for the previous month or do not have inventory on hand. There is a tutorial on the <a href="OMMP reporting page">OMMP reporting page</a> and also in OMMOS regarding how to report no onsite inventory or no transfers for the month. In addition, CTS will be required to be used if a grower is growing at a grow site where there are no patients growing for themselves, no matter the number of plants.

Communication regarding CTS will to be sent by email using the email provided to us when you created your OMMOS account.
