


- Interface replacement is scheduled for tonight; after which, Enteric will default to New Layout, but will still have the ability to revert to Old Layout using the button.

3	New Password Requirements – Stephen - Tasha sent an email to Orpheus users earlier in the week explaining State of Oregon's new passwords requirements, which won't come into effect until you need a new password and are prompted to change it. This applies to your citrix login, this account will be locked if you do not use it every thirty days and will be deactived if you don't login within 60 days. Please login!	All Orpheus Users need to become familiar with State's new password requirements.
	 Passwords will have to change every 60 days instead of every 90 days. Michelle has created an automatic reminder that will remind you to log in at 30 days if you haven't done so, and another reminder at 45 days, and at 60 days. These reminders are based on your user settings in Orpheus. Once your account is deactivated due to inactivity you will no longer get these emails. 10 characters instead of 9; can't use previous 24 passwords, no words in the dictionary, and at least one of the following: UPPER CASE, lower case, Number, Special Character (#\$(A#*\$&#), no blank spaces. 	All users should log in to Orpheus often to minimize account re-activation resources. If you are an infrequent use send yourself a reminder to login! You must login to Citrix AND open up Orpheus for your account to be active.
	 Warning: Logging into DUDE only will NOT keep your account active; you need to log into Orpheus specifically. Best Practice: Please fill out your User Settings to be sure you get e-mail notifications, etc. While the Orpheus de-activation alerts do not use the 	



4 Feedback New Online Case Log – Stephen/Tom

- Thanks to Tom, we began piloting the Online Case Log on 3/19/2018. The
 Online Case Log is primarily designed for Long-term care facilities that have
 traditionally been faxing line lists to counties. The overarching objective is to
 minimize duplicate data entry. Institutions and facilities can now use the
 Online Case Log to enter directly via their web browser.
- To avoid confusion, we are recommending that Counties also use the webbased case log when co-entering data with the facility, – this will minimize data issues and duplicates, etc:

Online Case Log → import to Traditional Case Log (Dude) → import to Outbreaks

- State will handle the importing from Online Case Log to Traditional Case Log in Dude.
- The LTCF will "submit" the Online Case Log when they are finished entering data, similar to the way Counties submit Outbreaks to the State.

Question: Can Counties be responsible for the "Submit" button? Yes.

Suggestion: Add a comments field.

Question: Can multiple people enter data in the Online Case Log? Yes.

- State can unlock and re-open the Online Case Log to LTCFs when necessary.



- Notice the REAL-D button below the Race Checkboxes on the Person record. It
 is currently optional, but OHA would like us to eventually adopt these value
 sets and categories. This is our first step toward that end.
- A pop up will appear containing OHA-prescribed categories, as well as the old "Sub-race" and "Race" values on the right side of the pop up.
- Clicking on the New Field will automatically populate the old fields located on the right side. WARNING: Unchecking a field to the left will NOT automatically uncheck a field to the right.
- Currently, no reporting functionality is available to the new REAL-D fields.

Ethnicity fields work the same way. Question: What field do we need to export to review REAL-D data? All fields Tom to follow up with Taylor and Kathleen Rees re: the are sub-race fields, except the "other" fields. specific Name of the "Other" Fields. Question: Do we have to fill out the REAL-D data? Not sure how interviewees are going to feel about potentially non-relevant race/ethnicity questions in terms of their particular disease. Answer. State has had discussions with its Office of Equity and Inclusion, which is developing interview training materials. Currently, REAL-D is being adopted by the Oregon Health Plan for in-person interviews. It is optional and we want to have a place to gather these data should folks decide to do so. One suggestion was to follow up after a person declares their race, say White. Another suggestion was to get the detailed REAL-D data at the end of the interview. Some grants and initiatives are in need in these types of data. Question: How about Language and Disability data? Answer. State has been making a concerted effort to document these changes in the Orpheus Release Notes on the Home Screen. That said, Language and Disability data in the very early stages and the State needs to develop a workgroup to determine best State to develop a workgroup to develop Language and development strategy. Disability portions of the REALD data set. Homelessness – June This began with the large hepatitis A outbreak in Southern California. We do have this Special Housing Field, which brings up an editable pick list of options, such as homelessness, Jail, etc. But that probably falls short of our needs.




- Multnomah County's STD program has some special project that incorporates the concept of housing stability as a risk factor. Thus, we've had the discussion to discern whether someone is homeless vs. having stable housing and have come up with the following three options: Stable Housing; Homeless, Unknown (to denote that we asked the question).
- In addition to having homelessness as a demographic, we've discussed adding homelessness as a risk factor attribute.
- Russ at Multnomah County is working with Jackson County on standardizing questions.

State to continue soliciting feedback with regard to Special Housing categorization and to reach consensus with regard to placement on new screens.

Russ et al. to consider standardizing a definition for homelessness.

7 Last week's training Webinar – June

- We don't have human rabies in Oregon, but it came up at last week's training that some people like to enter rabies post exposure prophylaxis, which gets transmitted to CDC as human rabies cases. If you want to enter a rabid animal please use Rabies (animal) and if you have a bite that someone opts for PEP, please use the Animal Bites Case Entry.



Lyme disease update – The Oregon State Public Health Lab does NOT do the Western Blot for Lyme.

New TB Layout – Michelle. There are a few differences in the TB layout: Labs are split into two different screens. The drug susceptibility tab is also a bit different. Michelle also mentioned that Orpheus does store negative TB results; hopefully the upcoming training will show you how to search for those.
